Strong Gale from the South
laying head to the East at night
Made moderate clear weather plenty
of birds all things took care for what
Oh my God help us to know that
we may once more return to these
Dear Land at Home mid and latter
part winds from the South equally

Friday April 8th 1859
Moderate winds from the South equally
at night in sail head to the West
mid and latter part calm light air
Lat 38° 49' Long 53° 49'

Saturday April 9th
Light air from the N.E. at 1 o'clock
took a fresh breeze from the South
headed to the West by the wind
mid and latter part fresh winds from
the North Lat 37° 56' Long 54° 55'

Sunday April 10th
Strong breeze from the North head
to the East at night in sail mid
and latter part heavy Gale from
North to N.W. wind whistling loud
Lat 38° 68' Long 53° 40'

Monday April 11th
Strong Gale from the N.W. laying head
to the East mid and latter part
Strong Gale from the N.W.
Lat 38° 11' Long 53° 54'

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Tuesday April 12th 1859
Strong Gale from the N.W. laying
head to the West almost heaved
mid and latter part strong Gale from
the N.W. at 6 set the topsails stowed
at 11 steered East

Lat 37° 33' Long 58° 30'

Wednesday April 13th
Strong Gale from the N.W. laying
head to the West at dusk came too near
the N.W. in all sail for the
night mid and latter part moderate
and fine weather plenty of birds & fish
Lat 37° 14' Long 54° 40'

Thursday April 14th
Light air from the N.E. at night double
reefed kept the courses hanging in the
breeches mid and latter part fine
weather wind from the N.E.
Lat 37° 33' Long 53° 28'

Friday April 15th
Fresh winds from the N.E. heading
to the S. & toward the North for killing Bay
nothing at night in sail mid and latter
part fresh winds from the N.E.
Lat 37° 45' Long 54° 26'

Saturday April 16th
Fresh winds from the N.E. heading
to the S. & at night in sail came too
head to the N.W. mid and latter part
strong breeze from the North
heading to the N.W. at 9 moved ship to the N.E.
Lat 38° 6' Long 54° 14'
