winds from the NW nothing in sight
Lat 39. 26 Long 54. 29

Monday April 18
Light winds from the West heading
to the NW by the wind at night in sail
as usual mid and latter part light
airs and calm
Lat 39. 47 Long 55. 01

Tuesday April 19
Light winds from the East heading
in to the Westward saw some fish back
mid and latter part fresh winds
from the North heading in to the
West. Dubble reefed
Lat 39. 47 Long 56. 00

Wednesday April 20
Strong winds from the NW
at night in sail heading to the NW
mid and latter part fine weather
head in to the Westward
Lat 40. 12 Long 58. 56

Thursday April 21
Fresh winds from the North at
3 took a right whale at 3 took
him to the ship at 6 finished
Catching in sail barometer rose
lightning saw thunder mid and
latter strong winds from the NW
Lat 39. 59 Long 56. 50. 52 fathoms

Friday April 22
moderate winds and a high swell
Cut the whale in to 4 parts
let him lay to lat mid and latter
part fine weather winds from the
West. Commenced sailing at 10 AM
Lat 40. 21 Long 56. 56. 53 fathoms

Saturday April 23
fine weather winds from the West
heading to the NW Dubble reefed mid and
latter part fine weather winds from
the NW at 9 finished sailing
Lat 41. 05 Long 59. 47

Sunday April 24
fine weather winds from the NW
heading to the NW by the wind mid and
latter part fine weather still heading
to the NW
Lat 41. 44 Long 58. 46
55 fathoms

Monday April 25
fine pleasant weather wind NW
heading to the NW by the wind caught
lots of fish mid and latter part
very fine and pleasant
Lat 42. 06 Long 60. 17

Tuesday April 26
fine weather nothing in sight all
day not a living thing mid
and latter part moderate and fine
weather heading East
Lat 42. 20 Long 59. 20
saw fish back at midday 56 fathoms
at night 50 fathoms
