Strong Gales from the NW lay head
to the NW mid and latter part
Strong Gales from NW specially
Lat 40° 44' Long 57° 29'
55 fathoms

Friday May 8th
Moderate winds and high swell at
Meridian made sail steered North at
2 a right whale came right ahead
of the ship bow and two boats and chase
him off mid moderate latter strong
winds from the North at 8 saw two
whales to bad weather to bear far them
Lat 40° 19' Long 56° 18'

Saturday May 9th
Strong Gales from the North at
made ship to the West at night
set the boats up chart reefed the main
to sail speared the fore sail mid and
latter part Gales from the North
Rain &c

Sunday May 10th
at Meridian wind started to the
West cleared at 5 more to the NW
mid and latter part Heavy Gales
from the NW attended with heavy
squalls Lat 39° 50' Long 56° 49'

Monday May 11th
heavy Gales from NW very
high sea mid more moderate
at 4 more to the South made sail
latter moderate wind NW then
died Lat 39° 23' Long 56° 49'
60 fathoms water

Tuesday May 12th 1859
fresh winds from the NW & Breeze
falling swell rising at night in sail
steered SE chart reefed main & sail and
fore sail mid and latter part moderate
winds and high sea heading to the South
Double Reefed
Lat 40° 33' Long 56° 05'

Wednesday May 13th
Strong Gales from West lay head to the
South at 8 more to the NW wind
SW blowing heavy mid heavy Gales
latter more moderate more to the South
wind freshening to the West
Lat 40° 26' Long 56° 00'

Thursday May 14th
Strong winds from the NW very
high swell steering SE at night
in sail mid and latter part moderate
calm Lat 41° 00' off in the Rips

Friday May 15th
Moderate and cloudy sun. Rain
at night in sail head to the NW
mid and latter moderate and squalls
Lat 41° 44' sounded no bottom

Saturday May 16th
Moderate and fine weather at 6 PM
sounded 70 fathoms double reefed
the sails steered NW mid and latter
part strong winds from the NW
at 4 made sail wind to the
South Lat 41° 08' Long 56° 45'
55 fathoms
