

Tuesday May 24 1859
Strong winds from the NW
at 10 took in fore sail. mid sail strong
Gales latter more moderate at 11 set
the fore top sail jib. Bailing
Lat 41. 25 Long 57. 11
48 fathoms.

Wednesday May 25
Moderate calm in play Bailing
mid and latter part moderate smother
in play Bailing and stowing oil
in the lighter hole
Lat 41. 36 47 fathoms.

Thursday May 26
Fresh winds from the NW heading
to the NE at 5 more to the west
finished Bailing at 3 PM mid and
latter part strong winds from the
NW in play stowing oil in the
lighter hole
Lat 41. 42 Long 57. 42
48 fathoms

Friday May 27th
Strong winds from the NW
heading on the western tack at
8 made ship to the NE at 5
stowing down mid and latter part
strong winds from the NW thick
and smothery
Lat 41. 26 56 fathoms

Saturday May 28
Strong wind from the NW thick
mid and latter moderate fine
weather saw one Right whale chased him
3 hours and gave him up
Lat 41. 45 Long 56. 20 54 fathoms

Sunday May 29 1859
Strong winds from NW heading to
the North at 5 in sail more to NW
mid heavy Gale from NW more to
the NW in fore sail latter moderate
high swell Lat 41. 45 Long 57. 43 fathoms
stowed oil at 1 saw whale at midday

Monday May 30
Moderate winds from the West at 2 board
for Right whale Cante net came up
came on board in sail lowered 48 fathoms
dark water mid moderate latter strong
winds from the North saw one Right whale
heading to the NW at 11 in all sail more
head to the NW had a very heavy squall
from the NW

Tuesday May 31
Fresh winds from the NW rain by
head to the NW mid moderate at 4 took
a Breese from the North set the top sails
dubbed Reeled latter strong winds saw
a Bark Lat 41. 00 46 fathoms

Wednesday June 1 1859
Strong Gales from the NW heavy
squalls by head to the West mid and
latter part strong Gales from the
NW strong squalls 65 fathoms

Thursday June 2
Strong Gales from the NW more to
the NW at 5 wind NW more to the NW
mid moderate latter a heavy Gale from
North by head to the NW
Lat 38. 50 Long 56. 15
60 fathoms
