

Wednesday June 22nd 1859
fine weather wind WNW employed
stowing oil in the fore hold mid
and latter part light airs and calm
Lat 40° 53' Long 57° 41' - 50 fathoms

Thursday June 23rd
Calm at 1 saw a few whales caught
net. Got near them mid and latter part
light airs and calm saw whales at 10
saw a shark then off saw more while
off at daylight. Lat 40° 48' Long 57° 40'

Friday June 24th
light winds from the south at
6 took the whale to the ship at
4 1/2 commenced cutting at 9 finished
got supper and set the macho mid and
latter part moderate and fine weather
slicing up sharks and hauling 51 fathoms
Lat 40° 36' Long 56° 36'

Saturday June 25th
Calm fine weather at 5 in sail
nothing in sight this day got a
little one side the whale seems
to be confined to a small place
and the current sets to the east the most of
the time mid and latter part light
airs and calm hauling and slicing
up sharks.

Lat 40° 35'
Long 56° 40'

Foggy calm weather
saw no more whale

Sunday June 26th 1859
strong winds from the SW at 4 took
in sail at 4 in fore sail near
ship to the SW mid and latter
part strong gales from the SW
finished hauling at 8 1/2 M by head
to the SW Lat 40° 14' Long 56° 45'

Monday June 27th
strong gales from the West employed
stowing oil in the fore hold at 5 PM
to the south mid and latter more moderate
employed stowing oil in the fore hold
Lat 40° 02' Long 56° 46'

Tuesday June 28th
moderate winds from south head
to the WSW by the wind nothing in
sight at night. Sailed kept mid and
latter moderate and fine weather wind
changes to the south and current setting
to the SE Lat 39° 43' - 50 fathoms water

Wednesday June 29th
moderate wind from the south heading
to the west by the wind setting up sharks
sea looking like whales now don't think
we will be gone the wind changes so we
can get back to the south then hope
to get one or two more before we
go in but our time is short and very
short days mid and latter part moderate
and fine weather winds from the south
Lat 39° 35' Long 56° 34'

Current setting to the SE
