

Saturday July 19. 1859
 light winds from the North heading
 to the East at 5 tacked to the West standing
 hale. Reached morning to the North
 hope to find the Whales again mid fresh
 winds from the North latter part wind more
 westerly at 9 more to the North 47 fathoms
 Lat 39° 18 Long 58° 01

Sunday July 20
 Strong winds from the West at 3 P.M.
 wind S.W. Steamed N.E. at 5. Double
 Reaped mid strong winds from the
 South at midnight steamed N.E. East
 at 8 AM have to descend 47 fathoms
 took in fore topsail steamed N.E. at 11
 till her came to the wind headed E.S.E.
 Lat 36° 58 Long 56° 15

Monday July 21
 Strong Gale from South laying
 head to the E.S.E. at 4 pm fore sail
 middle part more moderate latter
 moderate same squally at 8 set the fore
 topsail feet hake failed split the sail
 arched and bent a new one at
 11 saw three Right Whales came up near
 the ship called them at various hours
 for them Lat 36° 42 Long 54 fathoms Water

Tuesday July 22
 fine weather off after whales got up to
 two in the course of the noon had none
 got no whale there is something
 always in the way with same
 as they would do better mid and latter
 part calm and light seas lots of
 subarctic dapper bottom Lat 36° 38 at night

Wednesday July 23 1859
 light winds and calm at 7 lowered for
 Right Whales three of them got near was
 but it being calm they saw the boats
 saw plenty of subarctic bottom about
 80 fathoms mid and latter part moderate
 and fine weather at 9 lowered for Right whales
 this being a summer in sight at 10
 struck one at 11 took him to the ship
 Lat 36° 50 in the morning got
 no bottom headed in to the west of us
 the bank where the Whales wall

Thursday July 24
 light winds from the North in place
 cutting lowered one boat cut not fast
 at 5 finished cutting mid and latter part
 moderate fine weather at 10 wind fresh from
 the North lowered at 2 got no bottom
 No observation

Friday July 25
 thick weather moderate wind from
 the North in place backing at 5 in
 sail had the west mid and latter part
 moderate same foggy found the current
 setting to the eastward heading in W.S.W.
 and drift off Saccard's
 No observation

Saturday July 26
 thick and rainy standing still in the
 fore Peak at 6 started backing on
 account of Rain continued moderate until
 midnight then came the dampers blowing very
 hard took the waste part and all the traps beginning
 latter more moderate high sea at 8 began backing
 Lat 36° 55 Long 55° 40
