

Sunday July 17th 1859
Strong winds from the South employed
stowing oil in the fore Peak at 6 finished
packing heading in to the West middle light
winds from the SW latter part Calm
employed stowing oil in the fore hold
Lat 34° 06' Long 53° 50'

Monday July 18th
Light wind from the South heading
to the West at 5 more ship wind from
the West headed to the South mid and
latter part fine weather winds westerly
Lat 36° 14' Long 53° 10'

Tuesday July 19th
light winds saw plenty of finbacks
and two Right whales toward but
No Get Hind mid and latter part light
airs from the SW
Lat 36° 09' Long 54° 50'

Wednesday July 20th
Calm at night in sail mid and
latter part light airs from the SW
steering N.E. by E. Lat 35° 41' Long 52° 10'

Thursday July 21st
light winds from the SW
steering N.E. by E all sail trimmed
to the bearing mid and latter part
Calm Lat 35° 39' Long 52° 30'

Friday July 22nd 1859
Calm employed in stowing oil
about the ship middle Calm latter part
took a breeze from the South headed to the
East by the wind
Lat 35° 55' Long 52° 00'

Saturday July 23rd
fresh winds from the North heading to the
East by the wind ben employed all day reflecting
the Steerage aft middle equally thick some
rain at 2 AM wind slack the fine weather
steering N.E. by E Lat 34° 54'

Sunday July 24th
fine weather wind slack at 9 AM passed
the longitude 54° 10' steered
North per compass middle light airs
and calm latter part no breeze from the
SW heading to the NE by the wind
saw several sails in the distance of the day
one Clipper ship steering N.W. by W
showing the stars and stripes
Lat 33° 54' Long 48° 10'

Monday July 25th
light winds from the SW heading
to the NE by the wind at 4
passed a brig set American callings
middle moderate and backing latter a
light breeze from NE heading to the SW
Lat 33° 07' Long 48° 00'

Tuesday July 26th
light airs from the NE heading on
the Starboard tack mid and latter part light
winds more to the East heading North
Lat 34° 16' Long 48° 00'
