

Tuesday Sept 27th 1859
Strong winds blowing to the Eastward
by the wind under double reefed sails
at 5 more ship headed on to the East
at night in sail head to the West mid
and latter part light airs and calm at 11
the main land for a right whale
being very calm lost the Run of him
that gives some encouragement where
this is over I think there is more.
Lat 34° 37' 40 fathoms water

Wednesday Sept 28th
calm light airs variable all through
these twenty four hours the gale
still in light mid in the morning
No observation 42 fathoms

Thursday Sept 29th
light winds from the SE steaming
to the SW at night in sail head to the
SE 52 fathoms mid and latter moderate
dawn thick variable winds 32 fathoms
saw Sulphur bottom shells

Friday Sept 30th
thick and cloudy weather winds
drifted at night in sail head to
the SW mid moderate latter a strong
Gale from the SW Rain and heavy
squalls in the morning 62 fathoms

Saturday Sept 31th
heavy Gale from the SW lay head to
the SE mid and latter part heavy
Gale and high sea lay head to
the SE two bright in light
No obs

Sunday Sept 1st 1859
heavy Gale from the SW lay head to
the SE inclining to moderate
wind started to the South at 6 more
ship came up SW mid and latter
moderate and high swell wind Easterly
Lat 35° 38 Long 52° 59' 42 fath

Monday Sept 2nd
fine weather. Saw small class several
whales supposed them to be Humphreys
the India in company mid calm
latter part a breeze from the SW steamed
SE by N 65 fathoms
Lat 35° 46

Tuesday Sept 3rd
strong winds from SW steaming SE by E
at 6 in sail head to the SE 52 fathoms water
mid and latter part strong Gale from
SW at 4 more ship to the SE
Lat 35° 08 Long 52° 38

Wednesday Sept 4th
strong Gale from the SW at 3 PM
spoke shipabella of Baltimore
for Montserrat mid and latter part
strong Gale from SW lay head to the
SE the India in sight
Lat 34° 47 Long 52° 09' 45 fathoms

Thursday Sept 5th
strong Gale from the SE head to the SE
Clear weather at 3 drenched 46 fathoms
mid and latter part fine weather
fresh winds from SE the India in
light saw two brigs Lat 34° 57 Long 52° 12
46 fathoms water
