Friday Jan 13 1860
moderate wind from the North at 2 calm at 4 small breeze from N.W. at 6 saw sperm whales bowed but failed it to late to do any thing it is two months since we saw a whale then came at night had luck better so than when mid and latter part good weather.

But could not see the whales again

fine weather at 4 spoke the *Raccoon* mid and latter part moderate winds variable at 8 AM spoke the *Catfish* of Cranberry from Bay View for Matapoisett
