 on the Southern tack
 Lat 32° 34' Long 49° 41'

Saturday Febth 28
 Strong Gale same Rain squalls
 &c. Reel Reel mid and latter
 part Strong Gale from the North
 Duddle Reel holding on all was calm
 Lat 31° 47' Long 49° 49'

Sunday Febth 29
 Strong wind from North backing
 off and on hoping for a change of
 wind Lat 31° 51' Long 49° 43'

Monday Febth 30
 Strong North winds continue
 try to have it with Christian
 fortitude mid fresh wind North
 as usual latter wind West
 very light breeze
 Lat 31° 38'

Tuesday Febth 21
 light wind from West some Rain
 steaming N.E. mid and latter part
 fresh wind from the South
 steaming N.W.
 Lat 30° 09' Long 48° 21'

Wednesday Febth 22 1860
 fresh wind from the South squally
 steamed through the night N.E. & at 8 steamed
 N.W. at daylight steamed N.W. at 8 hrs
 10 miles from the land steamed a land
 course at Marion Island the South
 End of St. Catherine bore N.W. South
 to End

Thursday Febth 23
 fine breeze from the South steaming
 N.W. down the island at 6 o'clock Round
 the North End of the island at 8 came
 to anchor below the fort in 8 fathoms

Saturday March 4th 1860
 Strong wind from the N.E. Rain
 heading to the S.E. by the wind same
 thunder mid and latter part much
 the same

Sunday March 5th
 wind from the N.E. more moderate
 at 6 o'clock at 6 took a breeze from
 the N.W. steamed N.E. mid and
 latter part fine breeze from the
 West Lat 26° 41' Long 45° 20'

Monday 19 March
 fine breeze from West steaming N.E.
 all sail drawing mid and latter fine
 weather very moderate
 Lat 26° 17' Long 43° 45'
