

Sunday June 10th 1860
when we saw the land the north part of
stones came to the wind head NNE Run
over for Casco by off there the right went
on shore at 4 AM ship laying off and on

Monday June 11th
at 2 PM returned from the shore with
potatoes various pumpkins & Run over
for St. Croix saw a clipper schooner
laying off and on there at 6 Stearns & Ely
strang winds from NW at daylight
made sail at Maridian saw day
Satt 38-39

Tuesday June 12th
thick weather sun down to the land
rather to near halled off to the west
wind NNE thick and foggy at 6 in
sail head to the W mid and latter part
wind the same a little more clear Run
in for the land came on to blow more
ship off shore and gave up landing
for this day

Wednesday June 13th
strang winds from NNE some thick
at 1 more ship in shore mid all dark
& weather at 6 went on shore at day
latter part thick at times

Thursday June 14th
winds from the NW at 6 returned
from the shore at 3 took the launch
along side with the things from the
shore gave him the cash for the
water mid part calm strang breeze
thick and clear & at 5 went on shore
at 10 took the launch with mat. beef
and all other things do ends
