wind NE fine weather was
mid and latter part the same
Lat 40.38 Long 39.08

Tuesday July 10th
light wind NE fine weather had
to the South nothing in sight
middle Calm latter part fresh
wind from West
No Obs

Wednesday July 11th
wind West same thick saw
to sail one bark and ship strong
E & E mid part fine weather
latter fresh winds at 8 steamed
E & E for the Camilla Ground
in hopes of getting something
to cheer our Drupping Spirits
Lat 40.46 Long 38.23

Thursday July 12th 1860
strong winds from the West steering
NE at 5 spoke the ship Kodymer
from Buenos for New York
mid and latter part fresh winds fine
weather Lat 42.40 Long 36.28

Friday July 13th
fine weather wind West steering NE
strong breeze middle and latter part
strong wind from West steering NE
Lat 44.16 Long 35.32

Saturday July 14th
strong winds from the West steering
by N at 6 steamed East saw Blackbird
same thick not exactly fog mid and latter
part strong Gale from the West
steering to the East
Lat 45.29 Long 30.37

Sunday July 15th
strong winds from the NW
at 9 sail head to the NE
mid and latter part fresh winds
from NW two sail in sight whales
Lat 45.44 Long 29.15

Monday July 16th
good weather wind West at 3 PM
spoke the John Coggshall N. 15 35 days
at 90 bls sperm Got same meat
and bread from her mid and latter
part fine weather but nothing to
be seen as the Camilla Ground
Lat 46.14 Long 28.38
