

Thursday July 26 1860
fine weather wind to the West saw
the Greatest number of sail that
I ever saw in the same time at sea
mid and latter part fine weather
light airs from the West
Lat 41° 21' Long 33° 00'

Friday July 27
fine weather light airs from
the West mid and latter part light
airs calm &c
Lat 41° 25' Long 33° 28'

Saturday July 28th
fine weather very little wind saw
several sails two Whales were
supposed to be the Humpbacks mid
and latter part fine weather variable
wind but very light in company
with the Humpbacks
Lat 41° 25' Long 33° 20'

Sunday July 29
all this day light airs and calm
in company with Humpbacks
Lat 41° 04' Long 34° 00'

Monday July 30
fine weather slight breeze East
heading to the N.W. mid wind the
same but some duty light rain
steering to the West mid and latter
fresh breeze
Lat 40° 08' Long 34° 54'

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Tuesday July 31 - 1860
fresh winds from the S.E. steering
to the South the Humpback in sight. mid
and latter fresh winds from the S.E. heading
to the S.W.
Lat 39° 00' Long 36° 28'

Wednesday Aug 1st
fresh winds from the S.E. heading
to the S.W. mid and latter part
the same the Humpback in view
Lat 38° 30' Long 37° 00'

Thursday Aug 2nd
fresh winds from the S.E. heading
to the S.W. at 8 the Humpback saw sperm
whales to far for us to get this came dark
and soon could not see if the H. caught
one or not Lat 36° 54' Long 38° 00'

Friday Aug 3rd
fresh winds and fine weather
heading to the S.W. nothing in
sight mid fine weather at 4 saw
sperm whale at 8 toward far then
did not fasten at meridian but the
boats up. Got dinner kept the Run
of the whales
Lat 37° 54' Long 38° 00'

Saturday Aug 4th
at 3 toward far the same whales at
4 caught one small one chased the other
as long as we could see mid and
latter part fine weather at 5 back the
whale at 7 finished cutting so ends
Lat 38° 04' Long 38° 20'
