

Log Book of Ship Vineyard Bound
Monday March the 10

Strong Winds from N E and Squalls.
Weather steering W At 4 P M saw 2 ships
and saw the north part of oile At
4 P M saw Whale 5 load and struck
and kill 7 tuck him to the ship
Mid Part lying by the Whale Raney
At 6 A M knock on 11 A M finished
the body so ends with thick rainy weather
no observation

Tuesday March 11
commences with light Wind and rainy
bating in the head and clearing a way
At 6 P M Dubbled reef steering W Strong
trade Mid Part rainy Latter Part at 6 A M
commenced hailing At 10 tack ship to the
N E Wind N W off the land in site
could not see in Squally Weather
Lat 20 = 45

Wednesday March 12
light Winds and rainy Weather implid
in hailing the land in site standing
to the N E the Wind N W Mid Part
At 6 P M Dubbled reef the topmasts
a hailing between the Squalls Latter
Part Strong Winds a hailing heading N
under Dubbled reef topmasts the land in site
Lat 20 = 50

Thursday March 13
light Winds heading to the N under Dubbled
reef topmasts a hailing 4 P M finished At
5 P M made all sail heading W one ship
in site Mid Part Strong Winds steering
in Latter Part 8 A M bent the cables
At 10 got in to the bay and got becalmed
so ends trying to get in

In to Mohave I O 1845

Friday March 14
light Winds a trying to get in At
4 P M Calm the Ships 6 miles off
Mid Part light Winds Latter Part
At 8 A M came to anchor in 21
fathoms of Water 30 Ships lying near

Saturday March 15
light Winds sent in a raft of Casks
for Water and cooping the all and
steering down fine Weather

Sunday March 16
fore Part steering down oil light
Winds Mid Part light Latter Part
one Watch on liberty Strong Winds

Monday March 17
Strong Winds from S one Watch on
liberty Mid Part light Winds Latter Part
light got off a raft of Water and staid it
down one Watch on liberty

Tuesday March 18
light Winds and Squally implid in clearing
ship one Watch on liberty Mid Part
Strong Winds Mid agale from S S E Latter
Part sent down the topgalland yards and got
Ready to Slip a number of Ships slipped the
cables and went to sea

Wednesday March 19
A gale from S S E Mid Part At 2
A M slipped from Both anchors and went
to sea leaving 2 Ships to anchor out of
28 Latter Part Strong Winds and rainy from
W S W working out of the harbor

Thursday March 20
Strong Winds and Squally Working out
Mid Part Strong Winds Latter Part Strong
Winds from S W got up the topgalland yards and
got up the stumps and 10 A M the Captivity went
on shore with a bats crew
