Monday June the 23
light Winds from SSW hading SE with a thick fog saw nothing at sunset thick in sail Mid Part light Winds and foggy Latter Part light Winds and a thick fog imploded in craping the bow

Tuesday June the 24
light Winds from SW and a thick fog imploded in clearing the bow Mid Part calm Latter Part calm and foggy 2 ships in site

Wednesday June 25
calm sand overcast weather 2 ships in site saw no wonder of Whales At 4 P.M. look for a Whale going to fast to come up with at 6 P.M. a thick fog Mid Part calm Latter Part light Winds from SSW and a thick fog hading SE under topsails

Thursday June the 26
light Winds from SSW and a thick fog hading SE under topsails Mid Part light Winds Latter Part strong Winds from WSW and a thick fog hading SW one ship in site

Friday June the 27
strong Winds from WSW and thick fog hading SW one ship in site Mid Part strong Winds Latter Part light Winds from SW and overcast weather hading SE 4 ships in site
Lat 55=47 Long 150=01

Saturday June 28
light Winds from SSW and overcast weather hading SE saw a Whale going quick to the SW look and chart could not strike 3 ships in site Mid Part strong Winds Latter Part strong Winds from SSE and squally hading SW 4 ships in site at 10 P.M. could not see a Whale going to the SW to quick to come up with

Sunday June the 29
commences with a gale from SE hading SW under foresails and main topsails At 3 P.M. thick in the fore sail Mid Part strong gale Latter Part strong gale from SE hading SSW

Monday June the 30
strong gale from E hading SE under main topsails the water green Mid Part a gale Latter Part strong gale from E hading SSE
Lat 55=25

Tuesday July the 1
A gale from E and foggy hading SSE under close reef topsails and fore sail Mid Part light Winds Latter Part light Winds from ESE hading S with a thick fog

Wednesday July the 2
light Winds from SSE and a thick fog hading SSW Mid Part light Winds Latter Part strong Winds from SW hading SSE saw finbacks to ends with a thick fog

Thursday July the 3
strong Winds and foggy spoke ship Samuel Robertson the Capt. come on board in West end of her saw a Whale look i went in the other ships but struck the Whale got star one but all to pieces lost 3 iron one lance and a bit shade the Whale sunk with one iron in him had to give him a net but got a another top store Mid Part strong Winds Latter Part strong Winds from SW steering SE imploded in mending the but one ship in site

Friday July 4
strong Wind saw Whales look and struck and parted lost one iron saw more Whales look could not strike Mid Part light Winds Latter Part light Winds from SW At 6 P.M. look for a Whale could not strike 3 ships in site to ends
