Thursday July 2
Strong Winds from S and thick Weather
a boiling saw a ship Mid Part strong
Winds Latter Part a gale and over cast
Weather a boiling 11 A.M. finish
Lat 50-40

Friday July 3
a gale from W and over cast impleid
in booping the oil Mid Part strong
Winds Latter Part strong Winds from S
and thick fog at 10 A.M. commenced
storing down
Lat 50-07 155-09

Saturday July 4
Strong Winds from W and steering N.E.
a storing down in the fore peak
Mid Part a gale Latter Part a gale
from W and ship in site
Lat 50-40

Sunday July 5
a gale from W and a bad sea one
2 ship in site Mid Part strong
Winds Latter Part strong Winds at 10
A.M. for Whales could not strike
2 ships in site
Lat 50-55

Monday July 6
light Winds and fine Weather at 9
P.M. spoke ship Meneur of
New Bedford 5 Whales a boiling
Mid Part light Latter Part light
Winds from W at 6 P.M. laid and
struck and bled and took to the
ship at 11 commenced cutting
So ends one ship in site a boiling

Tuesday July 7
light Winds from W and fine Weather
impleid in cutting at 6 P.M. finish
the other ship still a boiling Mid Part
light Winds commenced boiling Latter
Part light Winds a boiling and storing
down So ends
Lat 50-55

Wednesday July 8
light Winds from W and over cast Weather
a boiling and storing down at 2 P.M.
laid for Whales could not strike Mid
Part a gale could down a raining Latter
Part a gale the bow Port got wash
of the crans and took her in to
mend So ends

Thursday July 9
a gale from S.W. and thick Weather
impleid in mending the bat Mid Part
a gale Latter Part a gale from S.W. and
thick Weather finish mending the bat

Friday July 10
a gale from S.W. and thick Weather
commenced boiling Mid Part a gale
Latter Part a gale from N.W. and thick
Weather a boiling long slow

Saturday July 11
a strong gale from N.W. and thick a
boiling Mid Part a gale Latter Part
a gale from N.W. and thick saw
one ship impleid in boiling
