To New Zealand 1846

Saturday October 31
Strong Winds from E S E a heading
S under Double reef topsails. Christ Church
Strong Winds Latter Part Strong Winds
from E S E a heading S under single
reef topsails
Lat 23 = 54

Sunday November 1
Strong Winds from E S E a heading
S under single reef topsails at 4 P.M. bent
the main topsail. Mid Part Strong Winds
from the E S E Latter Part light
Winds a heading S under all sail
Lat 25 = 21 Long 165 = 30

Monday Nov 2
light Winds from E S E under all
sail a heading S. Mid Part light Winds
Latter Part light Winds from E S E
a steering S S E under all sail implaid
in repairing the main topsail and trying
to stop the leak
Lat 26 = 45

Tuesday Nov 3
light Winds from N E a steering
S S E under all sail implaid in setting
up the head rigging. Mid Part light
Winds Latter Part light Winds from
N N E a steering S S E under all
sail. Saw nothing to end
Lat 28 = 41

Wednesday Nov 4
light Winds from N N E and fine
Weather a steering S S E under all sail
implaid in various gales. Mid Part light
Winds Latter Part light Winds from N
a steering S S E under all sail
Lat 30 = 26

Thursday Nov 5
light Winds from N a steering S S E under
all sail implaid in various gales. Mid Part
light Winds from N a steering S S E
Latter Part calm and rain to ends

Friday Nov 6
commenced with light Winds from E N E
a steering S S E and rain at 2 P.M. took
in the topgallant sails at 4 P.M. Double
reef Mid Part a gale and a bad sea
on Latter Part under foresail and main
topsails at 5 A.M. the Wheel got a
Way from the main and hurt her very
bad at 7 A.M. calm and a heavy
swell at 10 a gale at 12 calm

Saturday Nov 7
commenced with light Winds from
N and a heavy swell from S at
4 P.M. a heavy gale from S under
close reef main topsails. With a bad
sea Mid Part gale Latter Part a gale
and squally

Sunday Nov 8
a gale from W S W a heading S under
close reef main topsails and fore sails
squally Weather Mid Part a gale Latter
Part a gale from S and a heavy swell
on under close reef topsails
Lat 33 = 34 Long 163 = 20

Monday Nov 9
Strong Winds from S S W a heading S E
under Double reef topsails at 4 P.M. made
mad all sail Mid Part calm Latter
Part light Winds from N W a steering
S under all sail on bent the gib to repair
Lat 33 = 48
