Thursday Feb 11
light winds and variable imploded in various

light winds from N under all sail a steering
S imploded in scraping the Deck of the decks
and rattling down the rigging Mid Port strong
winds from NW and squally Latter Part
strong winds from WSW a heading S
under all sail one ship in sight to ends
Lat 38-55 Long 79-07

Saturday Feb 13
strong winds from SW a heading SSE
under all sail imploded in various jobs Mid
Port strong winds from NW a steering S
Latter Part strong winds from NNE a
steering S got out the foretopmast bearing sail
and sent the main reef and main topgalland
steering sail away Weather observation

Sunday Feb 14
strong winds from N and squally at 1 P.M.
the wind held to the SW in a squall at
4 P.M. tuck in the topgalland sails and
Duble reef the topsails a heading SE
Mid Port strong winds Latter Part the
winds shifted to the SW a steering
S at 8 A.M. set the main topgalland sail
at 10 tuck in the main reef and topgalland
sails a raining at 11 O'clock reft
the topsails to ends
