Wednesday March 3

light airs from S a steering N under all Down
Sails in flood in narrow gale 1 man sick of duty
Mid Part light Winds from N E a heading
N W under all sail at 3 A M took in
the topgallant Sails at 4 A M saw the
Dutchland Islands Distance 15 miles off
at 5 P M reefed the topsails 6 took Ship to
the S E and furled the mainmasts a took in
the fore and main topsails 8 took reefed the
main at 10 took in the foremasts a gale from
N E 4-ends

Thursday March 4

a gale from N E a heading E S E and rainy
at 2 P M Ship a Sea and lost a Part of the
bulwarks a bad Sea on Mid Part at 12 A M
the Wind shifted to the S W a bad Sea a
running a hulk could not carry any sails Latter
Part more moderate a steering N E at 11
A M under all sail

and stood N E under lost reef topsails and
fore sails with Squalls
