Strong winds from S.W. a steering N.W. h. l. at 4 P.M. took in the topgallant sails squally weather rainy. Mid. Part light winds and squally a steering N.W. h. l. Latter Part light winds from S.W. a steering N.W. h. l. under all sail rainy.

Monday May 3

calm and late squalls off water at 4 P.M. light winds from S.W. a steering N.W. h. l. under all sail. Mid. Part light winds from S.W. a steering N.W. h. l. under all sail. a thick fog. Latter Part light winds from S.W. a steering N.W. h. l. imploded in

painting the spars and barworks.

Lat 33-28 Long 66-37

Tuesday May 4

light winds from S.W. and fine weather a steering N.W. h. l. under all sail. saw a brig a steamer to the E.S. the water imploded in painting the spars and grasping the transoms. Mid. Part light winds from S.W. a steering N.W. h. l. under all sail at 4 P.M. the wind shifted to the N.E. in a squall took in the topgallant Sails. Dubbed next the topsails. Latter Part saw four the try works a raining saw a brig in observation.

Wednesday May 5

Strong winds from S.W. and rainy a steering N.W. h. l. under Dubbed topsails at 5 P.M. took in the fore and mizen topsails a blowing a gale. Mid. Part a gale from S.W. a steering N.W. h. l. under light main topsails and reef fore sails. Latter Part under Calcut self topsails a raining no observation.
