Thursday May 5  
A gale from N.E. a steering N.W. under  
close reef topsails and reef foremast saw a brig  
bound to the S. at 6 P.M. took in the main sail  
Mid Port a gale from N.E. a heading N.W.  
under close reef topsails at 4 P.M. took in the  
fore and main topsails. Latter Part a gale from  
N.E. out of the gulph in green water under  
close reef main topsails and foremast

Friday May 7

a gale from N.E. under close reef main  
topsails and fore sail heading N.W. with a  
bad sea on Mid Port a gale from N.E.  
Latter Part a gale from N.E. a heading N.W.  
under foremast and main topsails at 10 P.M. took  
Ship to the E. a bad sea and thick weather

Saturday May 8

a heavy gale from N.E. a heading to the E. under  
fore sail and main topsails. Landed a way one  
of the barstons got a taked on and set it up  
and got a wind taked up on the foremast and  
set it up to the lower truck in the fore sail  
at 5 P.M. past a merchant bark a standing  
in under close reef main topsails a very bad  
sea on Mid Port a heavy gale and rain the  
wind shifted to the N.W. Latter Part a gale  
set the foremast and main topsails

Sunday May 9

light Winds from W. a steering N.E.  
implied in various gales one ship in sight at 5 P.M.  
Latter Part light Winds from S.E. Latter  
Part light Winds from E. a steering N.E.  
under all sail heavy weather

Lat 39-14 Long by Chr 71-56

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Monday May 10  
light Winds from E. a steering N.E. under all  
sail saw a ship a steering N.W. at 6 P.M.  
sounded and got bottom 55 fathoms black sand  
Mid Port light Winds from E. a steering N.E.  
Latter Part light Winds from N.E. a heading in N.W.  
one of the men named Chamberlain was sent to  
the Mr. Pears and refused to come on deck to  
Duty. Part join in the rigging and one of the  
men was sent to buy it and put him in  
the rigging. Capt. Thayer than 2 ours and set  
them down at 10 am saw Long Island  
Distance 10 miles at 11 tack off 2 barks  
in site

Tuesday May 11  
light Winds from E. a heading of from  
the wind at 2 P.M. tack in a heading  
N.E. Mid Port light Winds from E. and  
fagy. Latter Part light Winds from E.  
and fagy in site of Montory 7 ships  
in site so ends

Wednesday May 12  
light Winds from E. and fagy a standing  
off from the land at 2 P.M. tack in at  
5 P.M. took a Pilot out of the Belief  
Mid Port light Winds from N.E. a standing  
off. Latter Part strong Winds from N.E. a  
standing in thick at 11 P.M. took in the  
topgallant sails at 11 doubled reef the topsails

Thursday May 13  
strong Winds from N.E. at 2 P.M. saw the  
land 15 miles to the N.W. of Montory were ship  
off and close reef the topsails a number of sails  
in site. Mid Port a gale 10 P.M. took in  
the fore and main topsails. Latter Part a gale  
from N.E. a heading off E. at 10 P.M.  
took in the foremast a number of sails
