

Log Book of Ship Tineyard

Friday May 14

A gale from N.E. a hading E.S.E. under close reef topsails a rather ship to the leeward saw a ship steering for New York. Mid Port a heavy gale from N.E. and squally. Split the fore topmast. Sailed took it in and repaired it and bent it a gin. Latter Part a gale a hading to the E.S.E.

Saturday May 15

a heavy gale from N.E. and overcast weather under close reef topsails a hading E.S.E. a bark in site. Mid Port a gale. Latter Part a gale from N.E. a hading E.S.E. under close reef main topsails and stables.

Sunday May 16

a gale from N.E. under close reef main topsails a hading E.S.E. thick weather saw one bark. Mid Port a gale. Latter Part at 6 A.M. saw ship to the N.W. the wind from N.E. but a deep forecastle and bent a close mizen. So ended with a gale. Lat 38=40 Long 73=11

Monday May 17

a gale from N.E. a hading N.W. under close reef main topsails and reef forecastle. Saw 3 ships at 7 A.M. saw ship to the E.S.E. Mid Port at 1 A.M. saw double reef topsails. Latter Part strong winds from N.E. kind ship to the N.W. and made all sail a heavy swell from E. saw a number of sail. Lat 38=42 Long 73=47

Tuesday May 18

light winds from N.E. a hading N.W. under all sail at 4 A.M. saw ship to the E.S.E. our ship in site. the look back of Doctor. Mid Port light winds and baffling and calm. Latter Part light winds from N.W. and foggy a steering N.E. under all sail to ends.

Wednesday May 19

light winds from N.W. a steering N.E. under all sail fine weather a number of sails in site. Mid Port light winds from N.W. a steering N.E. under all sail. Latter Part light and from S. in flood in painting the Mast and blacking the beads a number of sail in site.

Lat 40=24 Long by Loran 71=51

Thursday May 20

calm a number of sails in site in flood in painting fine weather. Mid Port light winds from N.E. a hading E. Latter Part light winds spoke a pilot boat and got home meet at 10 A.M. took ship to the N. to ends with a number of sail in site.

Friday May 21

light winds from E.N.E. a hading in N. under all sail at 1 A.M. saw Block Island a hading N.W. at 6 A.M. took ship off New York in site a hading S.E. Mid Port light winds from N.E. a hading E. under all sail. Latter Part light winds from E. at 7 A.M. took ship to the N. under all sail at 9 A.M. saw gayhads leaving. N.E. distance 25 miles got the anchors off the bows a standing in to the sound at 11 A.M. calm at 12 noon. gayhads home N. 9 miles to ends.
