pleasant weather unbent the
main top sail to appear Lat 1-17.4-30

Saturday 11th all this day heavy squalls
calms & rainey weather at 3 1/2
am made the land Dundas Island Bearing
8 1/2 N Dist 14 miles 86 06

Sunday 12th first part of the 24 hours
heavy rain squalls middle
& latter part mod gales with good weather
at 2 M Dundas Island Bore 1/2 N
Lat 1-10.50-01.00 Lon 173-38

Monday 13th all these 24 hours moderate gales
with flying clouds at 6 pm a
small Island Bearing 8 1/2 N 8 miles Dist
Lat 1-13.0-46.0 Lon 173-46 East

Tuesday 14th all these 24 hours moderate trades
with sun flying clouds with small
Island Bearing 8 1/2 N the same we saw yester
day Lat 1-13.0-28 miles 8 long at 4 1/2 pm 173-30

Wednesday 15th all these 24 hours moderate gales
with flying clouds at 10 am made
the land Halls Island from 18.50-19.50
Dist 14 miles Lat 1-13.0-56.0 Lon 173-32.0 at 4 1/2

Thursday 16th first part of these 24 hours fresh gales
with heavy rain squalls at 11 am past noon
while getting the fore top sail Mr Mumford
wanted to black the weather Bore he told
per cent in blacking it & he the yard was
square & ordered him to belay it while
he did with a good deal of care & pushion
after the sail was hoisted up & told him
the yard was not square then he said
sun on had blacked it told him that it
had not been blacked & he did not want

to see so many of his ones for I would not
put up with them he said then I must stop
his breath for he was not born in the

Lat 1-10.5-17.0 Lon 171-57.8

Saturday 18th all these 24 hours moderate trades
with sun squalls bent the new
main top sail unbent the fore top sail &
bent the old English top sail Lat 1-11.0-29

Sunday 19th first 1/2 middle parts of these 24 hours
light wind from East latter part light
winds from 18 1/2 N Lat 1-11.0-13.8

Monday 20th all these 24 hours moderate wind
with sun rain squalls & flying
clouds Lat 1-13.0-24.0 Lon 172-30

Tuesday 21th all these 24 hours light wind heavy
squalls & calms with no fish
Lat 1-14.0-10.0 Lon 172-57-30

Wednesday 22th all these 24 hours Calms heavy squalls
with heavy rain Lat 1-15.0-17.0 Lon 173-22

Thursday 23th all these 24 hours moderate gales Calms
with & heavy squalls of rain but
no fish Lat 1-16.0-18.0 Lon 173-30.8
