

Saturday 15th of September 1834 all these 24 hours moderate gales with good weather. Stowed down 32 Barrels of oil Lat 17° 34' to 17° 23' 30"

Sund 16th } all these 24 hours mod gales from West with good weather Lat 18° 40' to 17° 31' 30"

Mon 17th } all these 24 hours light winds with pleasant weather Lat 20° 11' 17" 19"

Tues 18th } all these 24 hours light winds & calms with good weather Lat 20° 58' to 17° 26'

Wed 19th } first part of these 24 hours mod gales Middle } latter part heavy gales with thunder & lightning Lat 22° 24' 30" Long 174° 35'

Thurs 20th } all these 24 hours mod gales with good weather Lat 23° 54' Long 173° 17' 22' 54'

Friday 21st } all these 24 hours moderate gales with fine weather at 7 am saw 3 sperm whales at 8 lowered boats returned got more at 10. Saw a more whales hauled out 12 M Boats off Lat 23° 12' 12' 21'

Satur 22nd } all this day light airs & calms at 2 the boats returned whales which could not strike so end, had back this day Lat 25° 27' to 22° 6' 30"

Sund 23rd } all this day light airs & calms with no tide. Lat 25° 37' Long 172° 30' 45' 30"

Mon 24th } all this day light winds with pleasant weather Lat 25° 50' to 23° 17' 45' 15' 30' 45'

Tues 25th } these 24 hours begins continues with light winds & pleasant weather Lat 25° 30' to 23° 38' 45' 17' 42' 8'

Wed 26th } all these 24 hours mod trades with good weather Lat 27° 58' Long 172° 41' 30' 8'

Thurs 27th } these 24 hours begins continues with light winds & pleasant weather Lat 29° 43' Long 172° 08' 00'

Friday 28th } all this day light winds with sun clouds weather Lat 30° 11' 42' Long 174° 12' 20'

Satur 29th } first part of these 24 hours cloudy rainy weather Lat 31° 13' to 17° 25' 25' 25'

Sund 30th } all these 24 hours light winds at 3 5 13 to 18 with cloudy weather Lat 31° 18' 17' 45' 45'

Mon 1st Dec 1834 } all this day moderate winds at south with sun & cloudy weather Lat 31° 30' Long 173° 45' 8'

Tuesday December 2nd 1834

all these 24 hours moderate gales with sun rain squalls & cloudy weather wind from S to S by E with a heavy swell from South Lat 31° 22' to 17° 30' 00'

Wed 3rd } first part of these 24 hours moderate gales with sun rain squalls from S by E and latter part mod gales wind from S by E with good weather Lat 32° 58' to 17° 35' 45' 45'

Thurs 4th } all these 24 hours moderate gales with weather at 7 pm made 14 hauls then North Capt of New Zealand bearing South 34 miles distant at day light one sail in sight the land bearing from S 82° to East Lat 34° 20' to 32° 17' 23' 30' 45' 17' 22' 45'

Friday 5th } all these 24 hours light winds & calms with sun fog Lat 34° 59' Cape Breton bearing 30° 19' 30'

Satur 6th } this day begins with light winds & good weather stood in to the Bay of island. at 6 pm came to anchor in 6 fathoms water along side of the English Bark Sir William Wallis Capt Carter 22 months out with 750 Barrels of oil

Sund 7th } this day all hands for ward Demied Duty on the 10 they went to work on the 6 hands run away on 4 returned But soon run again 2 of 3 mates got drunk animals of times at last they run off 8 of the crew run away 2 mates & 1 Dir changed the 4 mates Boats Steerer & Skipper more & sailed on the 11 of January 1835 with a full crew after a good deal of trouble & detention at this day

Tuesday 5th January 1835

at 11 pm Cape Breton Bore S 8 13 S 18 miles distant part moderate gales latter part fresh gales double kept the Topsails 90° 0' Lat 34° 20' Long 174° 12' 20'
