

Remarks on Board Saturday 26 January 1835
all these 24 hours moderate gales with cloudy
rainy weather & obs lat 32° 13' at 31° 25' to 178° 15'

Sunday 27 } all these 24 hours moderate gales with fine
weather at 10 am spoke ship & drift 19 minutes
out with 1000 Barrels of oil to the master
also bark rose of Halifax 19 months with 600
Barrels of oil also bark Huron of Hudson 32 months old
with 1000 Barrels of oil & obs lat 32° 15' to 178° 35'

Monday 28 } all this day light rain with good weather
at 6 pm sail in sight lat 32° 18' to 178° 47'

Tuesday 29 } all these 24 hours moderate gales with fine
weather & sail in sight lat 31° 59' to 178° 53' west

Wednesday 30 } all these 24 hours fresh gales with flying
clouds & sail in sight lat 31° 10' to 178° 38'

Thursday 31 } first part of these 24 hours fresh gales
& cloudy at 6 am spoke ship
Salma Cap. Price 16 months out
with 4,000 Barrels of oil mid part heavy gales latter
part fresh gales with a bad sea the Salma in
sight to seaward lat by obs 31° 25' to 178° 25' W

Friday 1 Feb 1835 } all these 24 hours heavy gales with a
heavy swell at 6 pm sail in sight
Close reef the top sails & fore sail at 9 am
found the fore sail lat by obs 31° 20' to 178° 50' W

Saturday 2 } all these 24 hours heavy gales with heavy blowing
rain at 12 AM part a ship sailing too under
bare to north Double reefed main top sail & obs lat 31° 25'

Sunday 3 Feb 1835 } first part of these 24 hours heavy
gales with rain at 2 pm took in sail & hove too under
the main top sail close reefed main & fore top mast
stay sail the ship in sight to the S. S. E. mid
part fresh gales latter mod made sail lat 32° 54' to 177° 55' W

Monday 4 } all these 24 hours moderate gales with a fresh
sea at 10 am one sail in sight a stern
lat by obs 32° 48' long by Chronometer 177° 28'

Remarks on Board Tuesday 5 February 1835
At 2 pm saw sperm whales at 2.30 lowered the boats
the west boat sailed along side of the whale but owing
to the boat steamer did not fasten at 5 pm saw the
ship that was astern take a whale along side
middle & latter parts fresh gales with flying clouds
at day light the bark rose in sight lat 32° 48' to 177° 23'

Wednesday 6 Feb 1835 } all these 24 hours fresh gales with cloudy weather
with a bad sea lat by obs 31° 53' long by Chronometer 177° 06'

Thursday 7 Feb 1835 } all these 24 hours moderate gales with sun
fine rain but no fish lat 31° 10' to 177° 52'

Friday 8 Feb 1835 } all these 24 hours moderate gales with sun fine
rain at 12 M the fresh rock bore & obs lat 31° 13' to 178° 18'

Saturday 9 Feb 1835 } these 24 hours commences with moderate gales
& cloudy weather at 12 pm saw sperm whales
at 3 lowered the boats at 5 took one along
side middle & latter parts moderate gales
latter parts with good weather at 12 M saw more
whales lowered the boats lat 31° 21' to 177° 9'

Sunday 10 Feb 1835 } these 24 hours begins with light rain
& calm at 6 took 2 whales along side
at 9 took one more along side middle
part moderate winds & cloudy latter part
almost a gale with heavy rain hard
work cutting out in 2 but work in
the other 2 obs long by Chronometer 177° 14'

Monday 11 Feb 1835 } these 24 hours begins the first part with
fresh gales from off S. W. but in the afternoon
began to blow mid part fresh gales from S. W. latter
part a heavy gale from S. W. with a heavy sea from
S. W. wind blowing strong too under the sail lat 31° 15'
