

Remarks on Board. Tuesday February 10-1835
First part of this Day heavy gales from ESE &
with a heavy swell from S.W. Sailing too under
close reefed top sail & mizen latter part heavy
gales with heavy thunder & lightning and heavy
rain stop sailing latter part more moderate
Began Boiling a gain batt 31° 47' Long 178° 45'

Wednesday 11-1835 all these 24 hours moderate gales with
sum fine rain at 11 am got three Boiling
at 11 am the french rock bore S.W. 13 miles
sail in sight batt 31° 27' Long 178° 48'

Thursday 12-1835 first part of this Day moderate gales at
6 am the french rock bore S.W. 6 miles
Dist middle & latter parts mod gales with
pleasant weather 2 sail in sight 31° 37' 48'

Friday 13-1835 first part of this Day light winds from
S.W. middle part almost calm latter
part fresh gales from S.E. at 2 pm
spoke the bark Huron Capt. Baranick
on board found the Capt. Sick this Day
stowed down 53 Bbls of oil batt 31° 39' 178° 55'

Saturday 14-1835 all this Day fresh gales with flying clouds
latter part one sail in sight at 12 M
the french rock bore S.W. 6 miles Dist
stowed down 10 Bbls batt 31° 22' of oil

Sunday 15-1835 all these 24 hours moderate gales with
pleasant weather at 8 am saw 3 or 4
whales, lowered the Boats at 12 M
the Boats off after whales batt 31° 02'
Maucoley rocks Bearing ESE 10 miles
Dist 3 sail in sight after the whales

Monday 16-1835 all these 24 hours light winds & pleasant
weather first part 6 hawing whales
at 5 the Boats returned with
out whales batt 31° 06' 30" 178° 58 miles from the
Rocks

Tuesday 17-1835 all this Day light winds & calm at 11
am saw 3 hawing whales
at 12 the Boats off 30° 33' the rocks 18 miles
Dist

Wednesday 18-1835 chased whales
till 4 pm Boats returned got none took them
up green Island Bearing ESE 18 miles Dist
Maucoley Rocks Bearing S.E. 9 miles Dist
middle & latter parts light winds & calms at 12 M
green Island Bearing East 2 miles Dist 30° 19'

Thursday 19-1835 all these 24 hours mod gales with pleasant
weather at 6 pm Maucoley rock bore S.W.
15 miles Dist batt at 31° 34' 178° 49'

Friday 20-1835 first part of this Day moderate gales with
cloudy weather at 4 pm spoke ship
map of Essex Bedford 20 months old
with 550 Barrels of oil middle & latter parts
fresh gales with cloudy rainy weather
at 6 am batt 31° 40' 179° 10'

Saturday 21-1835 all these 24 hours fresh gales with a
heavy swell 6 o'clock batt 31° 30'

Sunday 22-1835 all this Day heavy gales with cloudy
rainy weather 6 o'clock batt 31° 00'

Monday 23-1835 all this Day heavy gales with a heavy
swell day two in the mizen part
of the Day & under the mizen & main
top sail the other part 30° 54' 178° 35'

Tuesday 24-1835 all this Day heavy gales with a bad
sea at 10 am set close reefed fore top
sail & fore sail batt 30° 18' 178° 18'

Wednesday 25-1835 all this Day heavy gales with a bad sea
under close reefed sails winded 6 o'clock 178° 00'

Thursday 26-1835 all these 24 hours heavy gales from S.E. with
a heavy swell batt 31° 06' 178° 17'

Friday 27-1835 first & mid parts of these 24 hours heavy
gales from S.E. latter part more moderate with
a heavy swell from S.E. wind S.W. 178° 17'

Saturday 28-1835 all these 24 hours mod gales with a very heavy sea
the french rock bore S.W. 10 miles Dist
at 12 the Boats off 30° 33' the rocks 18 miles
Dist
