

Sunday March 7th 1835 at 1 pm sail in sight steering S.W. at 6 pm Sunday Island bearing S.W. mid of later parts light winds & calms with a heavy swell from E.S.E. Sunday Island bearing North 22 miles Dist lat 29° 34' long 178° 13' W

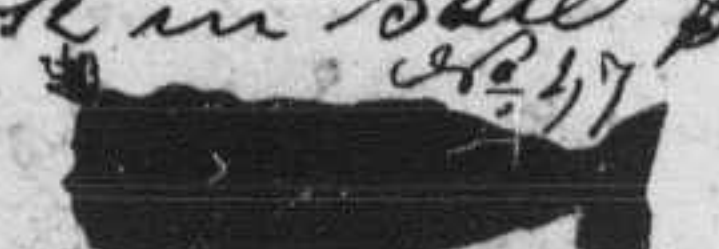
Monday 2nd 1835 } first part of this day moderate gales with a heavy swell at 3 saw sperm whales at 3 lowered the boats made one for or came off or rain signal & foggers at 6 the boats returned mid of latter part fresh gales with rain lat 29° 37' long 178° 20'

Tuesday 3rd 1835 } all this day fresh gales with a heavy swell from E.S.E. lat 29° 28' to 178° 08' W

Wednesday 4th 1835 } all these 24 hours mod gales with fine weather lat 28° 37' to 177° 59' 45' 178° 00'

Thursday 5th 1835 } all this day light winds with pleasant weather lat 28° 16' 177° 59' 178° 00' i.e.

Friday 6th 1835 } all this day light winds with pleasant weather at 8 saw sperm whales lowered the boats at 10 the boats returned could not strike at 11 saw more lowered the boats at 12 PM the boats off lat 27° 53' long 177° 49' West

Saturday 7th 1835 } first part of then 24 hours light winds with pleasant weather at 6 PM took one whale along side at 8 took one more along side took in sail & made all fast for the night

latter part made with good weather but in one whale & began to cut the other lat 27° 39' long 178° 01' W

Sunday 8th 1835 } this 24 hours begins with moderate gales & fine weather cut in the whale & began to Boil Middle part cloudy with rain latter part mod gales with fine weather Boiling out the tubbs lat 27° 16' to 177° 42' W

Monday March 9th 1835 all these 24 hours mod gales with pleasant weather Boiling lat 27° 06' 27° 11' 177° 14' W

Tuesday 10th 1835 } first part of these 24 hours mod gales with fine weather finished Boiling mid of latter part light winds with good weather lat 26° 49' to 176° 09' W

Wednesday 11th 1835 } all this day light winds with fine weather standing down all best the sun to 176° 25' W

Thursday 12th 1835 } all this day light winds with fine weather at 7 saw sperm whales lowered the boats returned whales going quick at 12 PM more whales in sight 6 miles off lat 26° 01' to 175° 26'

Friday 13th 1835 } first part of this day light winds & pleasant at 11 PM lowered the boats at 6 the boats returned could not or did not strike owing to one of the boats steering making a fool of at 7 PM saw more whales lowered the boats at 12 PM took one whale along side lat 25° 08' long 177° 17' W

Saturday 14th 1835 } all this day moderate gales with fine weather cut in the whale & began to Boil lat 24° 00' long 177° 50' W

Sunday 15th 1835 } all these 24 hours light winds & calm finished Boiling at 2 PM made the land the island Sunday Island bearing S.W. 25 miles Dist steering S.W. at 4 one sail in sight lat 23° 08' 177° 04'

Monday 16th 1835 } all this day light winds and calm at 6 PM one sail in sight at 10 PM saw a whale close to the ship lowered the boats & at 12 PM took him along side 36 lbs Sunday Island bearing
