Friday 17th 1835 } this Day begins continues & ends with heavy
+ } gales bad weather for whalers at 6 pm made
the land good & 35 miles Dist one sail
in sight latt 22° 48' S long 175° 12' Bow bearing 175° 12'

Saturday 18th 1835 } all this Day heavy gales with broken clouds one
+ } sail in sight latt 21° 55' S long 175° 18' West

Sunday 19th 1835 } first & middle parts of this Day heavy gales
+ } from East latter part more mod latt 22° 25' S long 175° 18'

Monday 20th 1835 } all this Day fresh gales with cloudy weather
+ } at 3 pm spoke the Bark Huron bearing 175° 18' West
1050 Barrels of oil 22° 06' S long 175° 30'

Tuesday 21st 1835 } all this Day heavy gales with cloudy weather
+ } at 8 am one sail in sight latt 22° 06' S long 175° 30'

Wednesday 22nd 1835 } first part of this Day heavy gales with rain
+ } mid part fresh gales & cloudy latt part light
winds & good weather at daylight 1000 lbs
Bone & 25 miles Dist latt 23° 24' 175° 18'
