

Thursday April 23rd 1835 first part of this Day moderate gales with good weather at 6 am byt'staunt Bone 8 or 18 miles Dist middle of latter parts light winds with good weather at Day light one sail in sight at 12 M. Byt'staunt Bone 8 or 18 miles Dist latt 22° 45'

Friday } all this Day light winds with sun fine
24th 1835 } rain 1 sail in sight to the S^W latt 22° 14' 174° 50'

Saturday } all these 24 hours light winds with good
25th 1835 } weather 2 sail in sight at 10 am made the land 8000 Bearing N 43 miles Dist latt 22° 42' 175° 12'

Sunday } first part of these 24 hours light winds at 4 pm 3 sail in sight
26th 1835 } the Sater 350 Bbls ole-montano 2200 Bbls oil - hiron 1050 Bbls oil middle part cloudy with rain latter part calm & clear latt 21° 45' 174° 25'

Monday } all these 24 hours light winds & calms 3 sail in sight at
27th 1835 } 12 M. 8000 Bone Dist latt 21° 17' 174° 26' West

Tuesday } all these 24 hours light winds with fine weather 1 am
28th 1835 } bound to Cavaco to trim our side & to get wood of water at Day light 8000 in site to S^W latt 20° 54' 174° 15' W

Wednesday } all these 24 hours light winds with fine weather at 12
29th 1835 } we made the land hoonga hapee latt 13° 06' 20° 36' 174° 6' W

Thursday } all these 24 hours light winds with good weather at
30th 1835 } Day light saw a hourse whale at sun rise ledent the boats & at 10 1/2 am took him along side

Friday } after a hard fight and began to cut
31st 1835 } 80 Barrels so ends cutting latt 13° 06' 20° 12' S the land in sight annamoka bearing 22° W

Friday } May 1-1835 all this Day light winds & pleasant
cut in the red hale & began to boil so ends the land in sight latt 13° 06' 20° 37' 174° 45' West

Saturday } all these 24 hours light winds of calms at 8 am
2nd 1835 } saw a hourse whale toward the boats & at 11 1/2 took him along side one sail in sight latt 13° 06' 21° 01' 174° 25' W so ends cutting & Boiling

Sunday May 3rd 1835 all this Day light winds with good weather at 2 pm spoke the Bank Luina of London 6 months out with 300 Barrels of oil but in the red hale & at work Boiling out the Blubber 21° 5' 173° 40'

Monday } first & middle parts of these 24 hours light winds
4th 1835 } with good weather latter part light winds with cloudy rainy weather Boiling latt 20° 30' 173° 16'

Tuesday } all this Day light winds with flying clouds with
5th 1835 } sun fine rain finished Boiling & began to stand down late 13° 06' 20° 04' 173° 20' West

Wednesday } all this Day moderate gales with good weather
6th 1835 } finished stowing down oil latt 19° 55' 173° 13' W

Thursday } all these 24 hours moderate gales with sun &
7th 1835 } flying clouds one sail in sight latt 19° 47' 172° 42'

Friday } all this Day moderate gales with flying clouds
8th 1835 } at 1 pm spoke ship Bowditch Capt. Gardner with 2400 Barrels of oil latt 19° 47' 172° 47' W

Saturday } all these 24 hours moderate gales with fine
9th 1835 } weather all hands employed tarring down the rigging latt 20° 11' 173° 02' W

Sunday } all this Day moderate gales with good weather but
10th 1835 } no fish latt 21° 00' 173° 20' West

Monday } first & middle parts of this Day moderate gales
11th 1835 } with flying clouds latter parts fresh gales with cloudy weather 1 sail in sight to the S^E latt 13° 06' 21° 19' 173° 43'

Tuesday } first part of this Day fresh gales & cloudy
12th 1835 } mid & latter parts heavy gales with cloudy rainy weather at 5 1/2 pm sundridhales latt 21° 14' 173° 14'

Wednesday } all these 24 hours fresh gales with heavy
13th 1835 } rain by gales latt 13° 06' 21° 29' 173° 04'

Thursday } all these 24 hours moderate gales with sun
14th 1835 } rain by gales latt 13° 06' 20° 58' 173° 28'

Friday } all this Day light winds & pleasant weather at
15th 1835 } 8 M. annamoka Bone 8 or 12 miles Dist 20° 35' 174° 40'
