

Saturday May 15th 1835 all these 24 hours light winds with calms if a heavy swell rolen & tumbling about very bad lat 20° 35' to 174° 27' W

Sunday 17th 1835 } first 1/2 mid parts of this day calm latter part light winds from NNE lat 20° 22' to 174° 11' W

Monday 18th 1835 } all these 24 hours moderate breezes with good weather lat 20° 38' to 173° 31' West

Tuesday 19th 1835 } all these 24 hours light winds with cloudy weather with sun rain lat 20° 48' to 173° 17' 3" West

Wednesday 20th 1835 } all these 24 hours fresh gales with thunder lightning & rain lat 19° 52' long 172° 03'

Thursday 21st 1835 } all these 24 hours fresh gales with rain but no fish lat 18° 43' long 171° 30' West

Friday 22nd 1835 } all this day heavy gales with cloudy rain weather lat 17° 29' long 170° 34' long 170° 54'

Saturday 23rd 1835 } all these 24 hours fresh gales with heavy rain squales 86° obs long 169° 55' W

Sunday 24th 1835 } first part of this day heavy squales with rain and latter part more moderate with clear weather but no fish lat 13° 15' 19' long 169° 48'

Monday 25th 1835 } all these 24 hours light winds with thunder and rain squales lat 13° 05' 14' 38' at 8 am made the land toooillak bearing north at 11 am at 10 am 29°

Tuesday 26th 1835 } all these 24 hours fresh gales with heavy rain squales at 11 am the land bore 88° lat 14° 00'

Wednesday 27th 1835 } all this day light winds calms & heavy squales with plenty of rain at 12 M toooillak bore 174°

Thursday 28th 1835 } first part of these 24 hours heavy rain squales mid part light winds & cloudy latter part light winds & clear sailing toooillak with the natives lat 14° 16' long 170° 00' West

Friday 29th 1835 } all this day moderate gales with sun rain squales at the island trading with the natives for hogs & getting ready to take off wood & water lat 14° 15'

Saturday May 30th 1835 all these 24 hours fresh gales with heavy rain squales split the jib at 12 M Beat up to the Bay sent a raft on shore after water traded with the natives one musket and 2 Barrels for 15 hogs saddle

Sunday 31st 1835 } first part of this day fresh gales with sun squales mid part moderate gales latter part good weather got off a raft of water & one Boate board of wood

Monday June 1st 1835 } first part of these 24 hours moderate gales with good weather stands away the water mid part heavy squales with a plenty of rain latter part good weather got off on Boate board of wood & sent a raft on shore for water lat 14° 15' long 169° 58' W

Tuesday 2nd 1835 } all these 24 hours light winds with good weather got off a raft of water & 2 loads of wood so ends 1 sail in sight

Wednesday 3rd 1835 } all this day fine weather got off a raft of water & 3 Boate loads of wood

Thursday 4th 1835 } all these 24 hours moderate gales with good weather got all the ribbon on board & 150 barrels of water getting ready to start after the sporting fish a gain so ends

Friday 5th 1835 } all these 24 hours moderate gales with good weather at 4 am shook the ship mounted 2500 barrels of oil she had 3 men munched got ready & left the land found one more man munched also for a Cask out of 10 that came off in the last raft salt water in Steed of fresh lat 13° 27' to 169° 48' so ends 3 men sick

Saturday 6th 1835 } all this day moderate gales from S E with good weather stowing away wood & water lat 12° 47' 168° 50'

Sunday 7th 1835 } all these 24 hours moderate gales at S E with good weather lat 12° 00' to 167° 58' West

Monday 8th 1835 } first part of these 24 hours mid gales from S E mid part cloudy latter part gales from S E mid heavy rain 86° obs lat 13° 17' 167° 11'
