Voyage in the North Atlantic

Remarks onboard Friday 16th 1850
 First part of this day very moderate
 and pleasant latter part gentle breeze
 and fine saw Pinbacks with out
 number say from twenty five to thirty
 Lat 31-12 Long 49-30

Remarks onboard Saturday 17th 1850
 All this day gentle breeze and fine
 weather saw one Pinback killed three
 head whale and two Whaling. Cows
 Lat 32-00 Long 48-29

Remarks onboard Sunday 18th 1850
 All this day moderate breeze and fine
 first part wind from North latter part
 wind from E. Coast saw two Pinbacks
 Lat 32-38 Long 48-48

Remarks onboard Monday 19th 1850
 All this day gentle breeze and very
 fine saw a ship bound S. Coast saw
 a Grampus one shoal of Porpoises
 toward all three Boats and gave
 chase but two down got none
 Lat 33-36 Long 48-30 Collard Water

Whale

Remarks onboard Tuesday 20th 1850
 First part of this day light air
 from South latter part gentle
 breeze and cloudy at 4 P.M.
 raised a large shoal of small
 Whales toward all three Boats and
 struck and killed several and saw
 eight cut in six of them so ends day
 Lat 34-24 Long 48-10

Remarks onboard Wednesday 21st 1850
 All this day moderate and fine cut in
 the rest of them and worked the whales
 saw Pinbacks with out number saw

Remarks onboard Thursday 22nd 1850
 All this day gentle breeze from East
 and fine saw Pinbacks with out number
 saw three Carcasses supposed them to be seals
 saw one sail supposed to be a Merchant
 so ends this day Bowline Lat 34-30 Long 47-30

Remarks onboard Friday 23rd 1850
 First part of this day gentle breeze and
 fine latter part fresh breeze and cloudy
 saw several Pinbacks also a Grampus so ends
 this day finished a Boiling supposed eight
 Lat 34-00 Long 47-30

Remarks onboard Saturday 24th 1850
 All this day fresh breeze and cloudy showed
 down the oil (tong) 82 lbs of Boddy and
 24 lbs of Grease saw two Pinbacks also a
 Grampus and a shoal of Porpoises struck one
 and saved him first one for the Cruise
 saw a sail bound to North Coast so ends day
 Lat 34-12 Long 47-52

Remarks onboard Sunday 25th 1850
 All this day fresh gale and cloudy
 broke the Chain to the Stays put on
 a spruce and set up on standing part
 so ends this day trying to under Double reef
 Foresail and Tysail
 Lat 34-13 Long 48-05

Remarks onboard Monday 26th 1850
 All this day fresh breeze and squally
 trying to under Double reef Foresail
 and Tysail so ends this day trying to S. Coast
 Lat 34-20 Long 48-00 1/4

Remarks onboard Tuesday 27th 1850
 All this day fresh gale and cloudy
 saw two ships bound to S. Coast and saw
 Pinbacks Lat 35-52 Long 48-15
