 and cloudy middle part Calm latter
 part gentle breeze and fine fired the
 Jubilee and let down the rigging fore & aft

 saw a Whaler Brig bound to the S. East
 saw a shoal of Blackfish toward East did
 not strike saw a shoal of Porpoise

 All this day gentle breeze and fine
 saw a Whaler Brig lying a bark
 just before we got up with her she lay
 off and went East of us continued fine

 latter part Calm saw five shoals of
 Porpoise and one shoal of Blackfish
 struck and killed two took third on deck

 saw one Drumpkin Sloop the ship
 from the of Baltimore bound South
 supposed bound to Cape Horn & England
 Lat 34-24 Long 42-00

 First part of this day fresh breeze and
 cloudy & smoky latter part moderate and
 squally at 5 A.M. raised two large
 sperm whales toward the boat and gave
 us chase they were bound to Mindward could
 not get up with them at 9 A.M. raised a
 shoal of whale bound to Mindward could
 not get up with them at 3 P.M. raised a shoal
 of whale bound to Mindward saw three more
