 1851 All this day fresh gale from S.W. West
 and squally with rain saw several shoals
 of Porpoises saw a Portugez Boat standing S.E.
 at Sunset Payol bore S.W. Dist 25 Miles
- May 15th Remarks on board Thursday 15th 1851
 1851 First part of this day fresh gale from
 S.W. West and rainy, middle light air and
 rain, latter part calm and fine saw
 about forty shoals of Porpoises
 at Sunset Payol bore S.W. Dist 20 miles
- May 16th Remarks on board Friday 16th 1851
 1851 First part of this day, calm latter
 part fresh breeze from the S.W. West
 looked at Payol and landed latter
 saw the Gunbarter of New Bedford
 10 Months out with 100 Barrels of Sperd
- May 17th Remarks on board Saturday 17th 1851
 1851 First part of this day calm latter part
 gentle breeze and rainy, saw thousands
 of Porpoises saw a Whaling Brig supposed
 to be the Harbinger also saw a large English
 Ship supposed to be a Man of War at Sunset
 Payol bore S.W. West Distance 25 Miles
- May 18th Remarks on board Sunday 18th 1851
 1851 First part of this day calm latter part
 light air from S.E. and pleasant saw
 two Banks two Brig bound to the S.E. East
 also a Schooner bound N.W. West saw two Schooners
 at Sunset judged that we were on third
 from Payol to Floor 20 and this day
- May 19th Remarks on board Monday 19th 1851
 1851 All this day gentle breeze and fine
 saw several Finbacks and a shoal of
 Porpoises also saw several Merchant Ships
 bound to the Eastward at Sunset (bore S.E. Dist 10 miles)

 1851 All this day gentle breeze and fine
 saw several Finbacks also four
 Merchantmen bound to the Eastward
 exchanged Colliers with an English Ship
 at Sunset (bore S.E. Dist 20 miles)
- May 21th Remarks on board Wednesday 21th 1851
 1851 All this day gentle breeze and fine saw
 several shoals of Porpoises saw a Whaling
 Ship bound to the Eastward also one
 Merchant Ship bound to the S.E. East
 Lat 39=49 Long 75=33
- May 22th Remarks on board Thursday 22th 1851
 1851 First part of this day gentle breeze
 latter part fresh breeze and cloudy saw
 several Finbacks one shoal of Porpoises
 saw a Merchant Brig bound to the Eastward
 Lat 38=15 Long 76=39
- May 23th Remarks on board Friday 23th 1851
 1851 First part of this day fresh breeze
 and squally, latter part light air and
 pleasant saw several Finbacks saw
 a Brig a Whaler also a Schooner bound to West
 Lat 37=50 Long 76=35
- May 24th Remarks on board Saturday 24th 1851
 1851 All this day fresh breeze from S.E. East
 and squally, saw several Finbacks
 and a shoal of Porpoises also a shoal of
 Blackfish saw the Merchantmen
 Lat 38=26 Long 75=59
- May 25th Remarks on board Sunday 25th 1851
 1851 First part of this day fresh breeze
 and squally with rain latter part
 fresh gale from S.E. East and cloudy
 Lat 39=25 Long 75=36
