First part of this day fresh gale and rainy
latter part fresh gale from S.W. with much
rain lying too under double reefed Fore sail &
Storm Tacksail saw one boat of Esko's
saw an English Whaling Bark from under
Lat 41 = 40 Long = 100

July 2nd

1851. We arrived on board Wednesday 2nd 1851
All this day fresh gales from N. & W. &
and cloudy saw a large school of Blackfish
at a large school of Porpoise saw a Bark
standing to the Westward supposed to be a Whaler
p. 1st 4.1-50' Long 15-20

July 3rd

1831 Remarks on board Thursday, 9th 1831
First part of this day fresh gales from
South and S.W. latter part more
moderate and S.W. only. Saw one Linback
and shoal of Black Fish say the Bark
Spartan but did not see her and
July 11th Left 11-17 Long Run

July 4th

1851 Remarks on board Friday July 4th 1851
First part of this day's gale blew from
South with squalls of rain later part gentle
breeze from S.W. West and fine saw four
Merchant Ships bound to the Eastward saw the
Spartan Lat 41-37 Long 75-04

July 5th

Remarks on board "Lutescent" 5th 1851
 All this day, gentle breeze from the North
 Lat 40:43 and pleasant. Spoke the Schr. "Walker" 18
 Aug. 24-29 Capt. Litten 70 owt. When saw two porpoises

also a Merchant ship bound to the Westward
