July 12th

1851

Remarks onboard Saturday July 12th 1851
First part of this day fresh breeze from South latter part gentle breeze from WNW and fine saw one shoal of Porpoises one Linback also a Merchant Ship bound to the Eastward holed out the Black fish then being 4 1/2 fms

July 13th

1851

Remarks onboard Sunday July 13th 1851
All this day light air from West and very pleasant saw a Merchant Ship bound to the Eastward also saw a Linback

July 14th

1851

Remarks onboard Monday July 14th 1851
First part of this day light air from West and fine latter part Calm saw one Grampus also a Merchant Ship bound East

July 15th

1851

Remarks onboard Tuesday July 15th 1851
First part of this day Calm latter part light air from North and fine saw two schools of Grampus one school of Porpoises and a Sunfish lit up the Dead Stayer

July 16th

1851

Remarks onboard Wednesday July 16th 1851
All this day light air from North and fine saw a Whaling Bark also several schools of Porpoises and Grampus

July 17th

1851

Remarks onboard Thursday July 17th 1851
First part of this day Calm latter part gentle breeze from WNW South and cloudy saw several schools of Grampus cleaned the vessel inside fore and aft & painted the two Quarter Boats so end the day

July 18th

1851

Remarks onboard Friday July 18th 1851
First part of this day fresh breeze from WNW latter part gentle breeze from West and finally saw two Merchant Ships bound East saw one Grampus and a Porpoise

July 19th

1851

Remarks onboard Saturday July 19th 1851
All this day gentle breeze from WNW and cloudy saw one shoal of Porpoises & six sail of Merchantmen bound to the Eastward spoke the Fish Boat of New Bedford one Masted out Chain saw one piece of Syria

July 20th

1851

Remarks onboard Sunday July 20th 1851
All this day gentle breeze and fine wind from North so ends this day running West

July 21st

1851

Remarks onboard Monday July 21st 1851
All this day light air from WNW and very pleasant saw two schools of Grampus also two schools of Porpoises so ends this day

July 22nd

1851

Remarks onboard Tuesday July 22nd 1851
All this day moderate and pleasant saw several schools of Grampus also saw four sails of Merchantmen bound East

July 23rd

1851

Remarks onboard Wednesday July 23rd 1851
First part of this day light air from North latter part gentle breeze from NE East saw eight sails of Merchantmen bound to the Eastward hauled the Boat and went to a Ship's Mast with the Iron work attached to it it had burst off ten feet above Deck from appearance
