latter part light are from S. East saw three
merchantmen bound to the Eastward saw
several Grapnel and two shoals of Blackfish
toward a Boat and went to knee of a Valley
and caught three Dolphin had two beautiful Shown

First part of this day, calm latter part
light are from N. West and suddenly saw
several shoals of Grapnel also three
merchantmen bound to the Eastward

Remarks onboard Sunday, 27 1851
First part of this day, calm latter
part light are from S. West and very
pleasant saw several shoals of Grapnel
also saw a Merchant ship bound to East
Lat 33-26 Long 42-10

July 28

1851

Remarks onboard Monday, 28 1851
First part of this day, calm latter part
gentle breeze from S. West and fine
saw several shoals of Grapnel saw
a Merchant ship bound to the
Eastward also saw one Porpoise
saw several breeches supposed to be
(Grapnel) to end this day

S. West and fine latter part fresh breeze
and cloudy saw a Grapnel also saw several
breeches supposed to be (Grapnel)

Remarks onboard Wednesday, 30 1851
First part of this day, fresh breeze from
S. West latter part more moderate with a cloud
saw one pair of better squid to end this day
Lat 36-02 Long 45-34

July 31

1851

Remarks onboard Thursday, 31 1851
First part of this day, fresh breeze from
N. West latter part more moderate
saw a Merchantman bound to the Eastward
saw a shoal of Porpoise to end this day
Lat 35-30 Long 43-40

August 1

1851

Remarks onboard Friday, August 1 1851
First part of this day, gentle breeze from
N. West latter part more moderate
saw a Merchantman bound to the Eastward
saw a shoal of Blackfish
Lat 36-25 Long 42-39

August 2

1851

Remarks onboard Saturday, 2nd 1851
First part of this day, calm latter part
suddenly and heavy with rain spoke the
brig America latter part light
saw 300 well saw several shoals of Grapnel
Lat 37-05 Long 44-50

August 3

1851

Remarks onboard Sunday, August 3 1851
First part of this day, moderate and squally
with rain latter part, gentle breeze from S. East
and fine saw a large Brig supposed to be
a private spoke the Brig Rover of Greenport
which made 18 months out 400 Basrells sperm
Lat 38-00 Long 40-30
