Remarks onboard Monday, Sept 15 1851
All this day, gentle breeze from East and
fine saw two sails of Whalermen, Supp. by
Bark touched at Laysol and left for same
Day, took onboard 20 Blk. of Eggs and
Union Water Nelsons Cumf and 30 30 30

Sept 16

1851

Remarks onboard Tuesday Sept 16 1851
First part of this day, gentle breeze from
N. East latter part fresh breeze from North
saw several Whalermen supposed to be Dramphead
saw a large Whale Spky also two Merchantmen
at dusk St. Michaels Cove (Calt) Lat 40 N

Sept 17

1851

Remarks onboard Wednesday Sept 17 1851
All this day, fresh breeze from N. East
and by night, at 10 o'clock a S. saw
St. Marys, Harving. N. by West Dist 40 Miles
to end this day with squalls of wind & rain

Sept 18

1851

Remarks onboard Thursday Sept 18 1851
First part of this day, fresh breeze from
S. East and by night, moderate and fine
latter part moderate and by day, saw a Whaler
Whale supposed to be the *Whale* Lat 35 N Long 2405

Sept 19

1851

Remarks onboard Friday Sept 19 1851
First part of this day, light breeze from
N. East and by night, fresh breeze from
N. East and by night, saw one Seal
of Spangulish saw five Whalermen bound
to the S. East and Landed with the
Whaler, R. 12 Month out Clear Lat 34-32 Long 24-18

Sept 20

1851

Remarks onboard Saturday Sept 20 1851
First part of this day, fresh breeze from N. East
latter part fresh gale and by night, saw two
Merchant Ships bound Eastward also saw
a Light Vessel being supposed to be a Whaler
Lat 34-31 Long 25-26

Sept 21

1851

Remarks onboard Sunday Sept 21 1851
All this day, fresh gale from N. East and
by night, with rain yesterday, sent down the
Lore Lymalt and Landed away the Begging
bunch this day, going under three, red, Lymalt
and Day sail Lat 34-44 Long 25-45

Sept 22

1851

Remarks onboard Monday Sept 22 1851
All this day, fresh gale from N. East and
by night, saw a Whaling Bark standing to
the Eastward also a Merchantman bound
to the Westward Lat 34-38 Long 25-39

Sept 23

1851

Remarks onboard Tuesday Sept 23 1851
First part of this day, fresh breeze from N. East
and by night, latter part gentle breeze from East
and by night, saw a large steam ship bound
to the Eastward Lat 34-38 Long 25-00

Sept 24

1851

Remarks onboard Wednesday Sept 24 1851
First part of this day, gentle breeze from East
latter part gentle breeze from N. East and by night
saw two Merchant Ships bound to the N. East
and one to the N. West also a Whaler being
a Whaler saw one Seal of Spangulish one of Whaler
Lat 34-22 Long 24-30

Sept 25

1851

Remarks onboard Thursday Sept 25 1851
First part of this day, gentle breeze from
N. East, latter part fresh breeze with a heavy
squall of wind & rain saw two Merchant Ships
bound to the Eastward & one bound to the Westward
saw two Whalers one Bark and a Corn Brig
Lat 34-21 Long 24-40

Sept 26

1851

Remarks onboard Friday Sept 26 1851
First part of this day, fresh breeze from N. East
with rain latter part fresh breeze from
N. East and by night, with a heavy squall from North
saw three ships bound to the N. West Lat 34-38
