1851 Remarks onboard Friday, Oct 10 1851
First part of this day gentle breeze from South latter part fresh breeze from S.W. and a few small birds seen with the Bark Margretta of Salem 5 Months out of New York
Lat 35=20 Long 24=27

Oct 11

1851 Remarks onboard Saturday, Oct 11 1851
All this day fresh breeze from South and cloudy, saw the Bark Margretta also one other sailing, Bark likewise a Merchant Brig bound to the Eastward so ends this day
Lat 35=04 Long 24=40

Oct 12

1851 Remarks onboard Sunday, Oct 12 1851
First part of this day, fresh breeze from S.W. and squally latter part fresh gale from South and clear so ends this day
Lat 34=30 Long 24=43

Oct 13

1851 Remarks onboard Monday, Oct 13 1851
First part of this day, fresh gale and clear latter part gentle breeze from South and cloudy, saw one Porpoise so ends this day
Lat 34=44 Long 24=40

Oct 14

1851 Remarks onboard Tuesday, Oct 14 1851
All this day, gentle breeze from S.W. and fine saw one Porpoise and a Gull bound to the S. East supposed to be a Whale
Lat 34=24 Long 23=26

Oct 15

1851 Remarks onboard Wednesday, Oct 15 1851
First part of this day, gentle breeze from S.W. and fine latter part fresh breeze from South and squally. Saw a School of Grampus so ends this day
Lat 34=13 Long 24=40

1851 Remarks onboard Thursday, Oct 16 1851
First part of this day, fresh breeze from South and squally latter part gentle breeze from East and fine saw one Porpoise so ends this day
Lat 34=07 Long 23=03

Oct 17

1851 Remarks onboard Friday, Oct 17 1851
First part of this day, fresh breeze from S. East latter part gentle breeze from S.W. and cloudy, saw a Merchant Ship bound S.W.
Lat 34=33 Long 23=31

Oct 18

1851 Remarks onboard Saturday, Oct 18 1851
All this day, gentle breeze from East and fine saw one Porpoise saw one Merchant Ship bound N.W. also a Ship bound S.W.
Lat 34=18 Long 24=33

Oct 19

1851 Remarks onboard Sunday, Oct 19 1851
First part of this day, gentle breeze from East and cloudy latter part Calm and clear shore a Spanish Brig from Corrobor bound to Havana Cuba so ends this day
Lat 33=22 Long 24=15

Oct 20

1851 Remarks onboard Monday, Oct 20 1851
First part of this day, light air from S.W. Middle of heavy squall of wind again from the North latter part gentle breeze from N.E. saw one Porpoise
Lat 33=50 Long 24=22

Oct 21

1851 Remarks onboard Tuesday, Oct 21 1851
First part of this day, fresh breeze from N.E. latter part light air from S.E. East saw one Porpoise saw a pair of a Carrack pair of Squirrels saw two Merchantmen bound to the Eastward so ends this day, Calm
