 and squally latter part latter part fresh gale  
 from North and saw a Merchant Bark  
 bound to the Eastward under close reef of Top-sail  
 Lat 28-54 Long 54-15

 Remarks on board Thursday Nov 13<sup>th</sup> 1851  
 First part of this day fresh breeze from North  
 and cloudy latter part fresh breeze from N.W. E  
 and squally saw a Merchant Bark running N.W.  
 Lat 28-50 Long 53-53

Nov 14<sup>th</sup>

 Remarks on board Friday Nov 14<sup>th</sup> 1851  
 First part of this day gentle breeze from N. East  
 and cloudy latter part fresh breeze from N.W. E  
 and squally saw two Finbacks & Porpoise finished  
 (Baiting) and commenced (Larino) so end this day  
 Lat 28-25 Long 50-14
