 First part of this day fresh breeze from N.W. East
 squally with rain latter part fresh gale from
 N.W. with a heavy sea so ends this day running
 under Double reef (Fore sail and Jib)

March 30th 1852
 Remarks onboard Tuesday March 30th 1852
 First part of this day fresh breeze from
 North part part fresh gale from West and
 squally saw the Merchantmen bound to the Westward
 Lat 55-12 Long 57-01

March 31st 1852
 Remarks onboard Wednesday March 31st 1852
 First part of this day heavy gale from
 N.W. and squally with rain at midnight
 the Wind changed to the N.W. blowing a
 heavy gale with heavy squalls and a high cross
 sea took in the two quarter Boats and slightly
 damaged the Stern Boat latter part fresh gale
 Lat 00-00 Long None

April 1st 1852
 Remarks onboard Thursday April 1st 1852
 All this day heavy gale from N.W. West
 and squally with a heavy sea running
 so ends this day running at Beach
 Lat 31-54 Long 50-06

April 2nd 1852
 Friday 2nd Remarks onboard March 1852
 First part of this day fresh breeze from
 N.W. West latter part calm put out the
 two quarter Boats so ends this day
 Lat 31-41 Long 47-53

April 3rd 1852
 Remarks onboard Saturday March 3rd 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from
 West and pleasant latter part fresh breeze
 from S.W. by W and cloudy saw one Shoal
 of Blackfish so ends this day
 Lat 31-30 Long 44-49

 Remarks onboard Sunday March 4th 1852
 First part of this day fresh breeze from N.W. by W
 and cloudy latter part strong breeze from N.W. by S
 and rainy so ends this day running under Double reef
 Lat 31-54 Long 41-10

April 5th 1852
 Monday 5th
 Remarks onboard Monday April 5th 1852
 First part of this day fresh gale from N.W. by W
 and squally latter part fresh gale from S.W. West
 and cloudy saw one shoal of Blackfish and one
 sail found to the Westward so ends this day
 Lat 32-51 Long 37-10

April 6th 1852
 Tuesday 6th
 Remarks onboard Tuesday April 6th 1852
 First part of this day fresh gale from S.W. West
 and squally latter part fresh gale and cloudy
 running under Double reef (Fore sail and Jib)
 took off one of the horns of the Foremast crossed
 Lat 33-00 Long 34-40

April 7th 1852
 Wednesday 7th
 Remarks onboard Wednesday April 7th 1852
 First part of this day fresh gale from S.W. by W
 and squally with rain latter part gentle breeze
 from N.W. West and clear with a heavy sea
 saw a large ship bound to the Westward
 Lat 33-11 Long 31-28

April 8th 1852
 Thursday 8th
 Remarks onboard Thursday April 8th 1852
 First part of this day light air from N.W. by W
 and fine latter part gentle breeze from
 West and cloudy had a look out for the first
 time since we left at 12-4 P.M. raised a
 shoal of Spume Whales bound quick to
 windward broke out the Craft and lowered
 two Boats and gave chase but could not
 overtake them put out the Mast Boat
 saw one shoal of Blackfish so ends this day
 Lat 32-45 Long 30-05
