April 7th
 1852 Remarks onboard Friday April 7th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from NW West
 and pleasant latter part gentle breeze from
 NW West and fine so ends this day
 Lat 32=55 Long 26=20

April 10th
 1852 Remarks onboard Saturday April 10th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from NW West
 and pleasant latter part gentle breeze from
 NW and fine saw one Sloop
 Lat 32=55 Long 22=55

April 11th
 1852 Remarks onboard Sunday April 11th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from NW
 and fine latter part fresh breeze from
 NW and cloudy so ends this day
 Lat 32=27 Long 19=55

April 12th
 1852 Remarks onboard Monday April 12th 1852
 First part of this day fresh breeze from
 NNE and squally latter part fresh breeze
 from North and cloudy saw one Blackfish
 Lat 30=25 Long 17=58

April 13th
 1852 Remarks onboard Tuesday April 13th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from
 North and pleasant latter part fresh
 breeze from N East and clear saw two
 shoals of Porpoise one Grampus and shoal
 of Blackfish also one sail hoisted West
 at 5 o'clock made Benicoffe bearing SPM
 Lat 20 miles at sunset it bore SPM 12 miles

April 14th
 1852 Remarks onboard Wednesday April 14th 1852
 All this day fresh breeze from N East
 and clear saw two shoals of Blackfish
 one Sunfish also a sail running before the wind
 at sunset Canary Island bore N 30 miles

April 15th
 1852 Remarks onboard Thursday April 15th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from N East
 and cloudy latter part fresh breeze from NNE
 and cloudy saw four Sloop to ends this day
 Lat 26=57 Long 14=48

April 16th
 1852 Remarks onboard Friday April 16th 1852
 All this day fresh breeze from N East and
 cloudy saw one Sloop several braced Sloop
 them to be Grampus saw a Horny Brig
 turning up the Island also a notice sail
 at sunset Canary Island bore South 18 miles

April 17th
 1852 Remarks onboard Saturday April 17th 1852
 First part of this day fresh breeze from N East
 latter part more moderate saw three shoals of
 Porpoise one Shoal of Blackfish and two Sloop
 at sunset Canary bore North 30 miles

April 18th
 1852 Remarks onboard Sunday April 18th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze and cloudy
 latter part gentle breeze from N East and
 clear saw one shoal of Porpoise and one Sloop
 Lat 25=44 Long 16=11

April 19th
 1852 Remarks onboard Monday April 19th 1852
 All this day gentle breeze and clear wind
 from N East saw four Sloop and
 two shoals of Porpoise that day sent up the
 fore topmast so ends this day rising SW
 Lat 23=42 Long 17=18

April 20th
 1852 Remarks onboard Tuesday April 20th 1852
 All this day gentle breeze from N East
 and clear saw ten or twelve shoals of Porpoise
 and three or four shoals of Blackfish struck one
 Blackfish out of the vessel and saw him
 saw four Sloop so ends this day
 Lat 21=32 Long 18=15
