All this day gentle breeze from North and
fair saw small shoals of Porpoises, Blackfish
three shoals of Herring, and one out
of mackerel saw a Brig, running S. S. West
Lat 20-13 Long 18-34.

April 22nd
1852. Remarks on board Thursday April 22nd 1852.
First part of this day, fresh breeze from
N. E. East latter part more moderate
saw one Herring and one shoal of Blackfish
Lat 19-41 Long 18-48

April 23rd
1852. Remarks on board Friday April 23rd 1852.
First part of this day gentle breeze from
North and cloudy middle fresh breeze from
N. E. latter part calm with a heavy sea
saw one Herring and one shoal of Blackfish
Lat 19-35 Long 18-50

April 24th
1852. Remarks on board Saturday April 24th 1852.
First part of this day gentle breeze from
North with light rain latter part fresh
breeze from N. E. by N. and cloudy saw
a number of Herring and one shoal of
Porpoises Spuck one but did not see him
Lat 19-32 Long 18-44

April 25th
1852. Remarks on board Sunday April 25th 1852.
First part of this day fresh breeze from
N. E. middle moderate latter part fresh
breeze from N. E. and clear ends this day
Lat 18-55 Long 18-48

April 26th
1852. Remarks on board Monday April 26th 1852.
All this day fresh gale from N. E. by E.
and smoky lying to under double reef
fore sail and stormy in fore sail
Lat 19-25 Long 18-42

April 27th
1852. Remarks on board Tuesday April 27th 1852.
First part of this day fresh gale from N. E. by
E. and clear latter part fresh breeze from N. E.
saw one shoal of Cowfish, so ends this day
Lat 18-33 Long 20-04

April 28th
1852. Remarks on board Wednesday April 28th 1852.
First part of this day fresh breeze from
N. E. by N. and clear latter part more
moderate so ends this day saw one Shark
Lat 18-22 Long 19-55

April 29th
1852. Remarks on board Thursday April 29th 1852.
First part of this day fresh breeze from
N. E. East and clear latter part more moderate
turned the reef out of the Main sail first time
for a week saw two Herring and one shoal
of Porpoises Muddid stuck the fish
Lat 18-30 Long 17-58

April 30th
1852. Remarks on board Friday April 30th 1852.
First part of this day gentle breeze from
N. E. and clear latter part fresh breeze and
cloudy saw four Herring and one Trumpet
saw a Merchant Ship bound S. West

May 1st
1852. Remarks on board Saturday May 1st 1852.
First part of this day fresh breeze from
N. E. latter part more moderate at noon
saw a large shoal of small sperm whales
Howard and Shugh and got two supposed
to make 15 Blk. and kept one in

May 2nd
1852. Remarks on board Sunday May 2nd 1852.
All this day fresh breeze from N. E. by E. and
clear finished cutting and started the work
