 First part of this day fresh gale from N. East and cloudy. Saw one shoal of Blackfish finished a fishing, carried away the haul-loom in the string in the act of giving latter part of the day more moderate

May 4th 1852
 Remarks onboard Tuesday May 4th 1852
 First part of this day fresh breeze from N.E. and a lively latter part fresh gale and clear finished a fishing, tow being 7,000 lbs of No. 1. B.C.

May 5th 1852
 Remarks onboard Wednesday May 5th 1852
 First part of this day fresh gale from N.E. and clear latter part more moderate saw one shoal of Porpoise so ends this day
 Lat 19-09 Long 18-52

May 6th 1852
 Remarks onboard Thursday May 6th 1852
 First part of this day fresh gale with a heavy S.E. latter part more moderate saw two shoals of Porpoise at 6 P.M. raised two sperm whales lowered for them but never saw them after

May 7th 1852
 Remarks onboard Friday May 7th 1852
 First part of this day fresh gale from N.E. and clear latter part more moderate saw one Finback so ends this day
 Lat 19-11 Long 19-01

May 8th 1852
 Remarks onboard Saturday May 8th 1852
 First part of this day fresh gale from N.E. latter part more moderate saw two shoals of Porpoise struck and saved one long one one Finback one shoal of Blackfish. Towed the Double reef out of the Fore-sail for the first time for twenty days so ends the day

 Remarks onboard Sunday May 9th 1852
 First part of this day fresh breeze from N. East latter part fresh breeze from N. East and clear so ends this day all well
 Lat 19-49 Long 18-55

May 10th 1852
 Remarks onboard Monday May 10th 1852
 All this day fresh breeze from N.E. and clear saw two shoals of Blackfish two shoals of Porpoise and one Finback so ends this day
 Lat 19-53 Long 19-16

May 11th 1852
 Remarks onboard Tuesday May 11th 1852
 All this day gentle breeze from N. East and very smoky at 8 A.M. raised a large shoal of large and small whales hauled and struck a large whale and ran the large end for end little by and by then lightning took up the boat and toward again for about half an hour and dodged a charge of whale until sundown but could not get upon him saw one shoal of Blackfish

 Remarks onboard Wednesday May 12th 1852
 First part of this day light breeze from N. East latter part gentle breeze from N. East and smooth saw one Finback and Grampus
 Lat 19-00 Long 18-50

May 13th 1852
 Remarks onboard Thursday May 13th 1852
 All this day gentle breeze from N. by N.E. at sunrise shifted a shoal of sperm whale round to windward spinn toward the boats but did not get up with them saw two shoals of Blackfish one shoal of Killers one shoal of Porpoise and five Finbacks

 Remarks onboard Friday May 14th 1852
 All this day gentle breeze from N. by E saw two Finbacks and one shoal of Blackfish
