May 29  
1852

Remarks onboard Saturday May 29 1852  
First part of this day light breeze from S.W.  
Middle part breeze from E latter part light  
breeze saw a ship board West so ends this day  
Lat 27-49 Long 52-55

May 30  
1852

Remarks onboard Sunday May 30 1852  
All this day light breeze from E.W. to  
East and very pleasant so ends this day  
Lat 29-02 Long 53-18

May 31  
1852

Remarks onboard Monday May 31 1852  
First part of this day light breeze from S.W. by E  
latter part light breeze from S.E. East toiled  
the little Makale then being about three Mils  
Lat 30-07 Long 53-10

June 1  
1852

Remarks onboard Tuesday June 1st 1852  
First part of this day fresh breeze from South  
latter part fresh gale from S.E. and squally  
with heavy rain so ends this day  
Lat 32-40 Long 52-45

June 2  
1852

Remarks onboard Wednesday June 2nd 1852  
First part of this day fresh gale from S.W.  
and squally latter part fresh breeze from S.E. by E  
and cloudy struck down the bit then being  
three Mils saw one shoal of Porpoise  
Lat 35-58 Long 52-27

June 3  
1852

Remarks onboard Thursday June 3rd 1852  
First part of this day gentle breeze from  
S.W. latter part gentle breeze and rainy at  
5 P.M. made Rio bearing East dist 50 Miles  
saw several shoals of Porpoise so ends this day  
at sunset at St. George bore S.W. dist 10 Miles

June 4  
1852

Remarks onboard Friday June 4th 1852  
All this day gentle breeze from S.W. by W  
stopped at Bay and engaged a Mainboom and  
left the same forenoon hauled with the Bark  
President of Westport Cook Master 8 Months  
into 2000 lbs Sperm also 5 other Whalers in sight  
at sunset St. George bore S.W. dist 15 Miles

June 5  
1852

Remarks onboard Saturday June 5th 1852  
All this day gentle breeze from W and pleasant  
saw the President also two other Whalers  
likewise saw three shoals of Porpoise and three  
at sunset Rio bore S.W. dist 40 Miles

June 6  
1852

Remarks onboard Sunday June 6th 1852  
First part of this day light breeze from West and  
cloudy latter part calm saw one Whaler and  
a Merchant Brig, at sunset Rio bore South distance 50 Miles

June 7  
1852

Remarks onboard Monday June 7th 1852  
First part of this day calm latter part light  
breeze from S.W. saw several shoals of Porpoise  
one Linbark caught one Turtle and put the  
new Tilt and sent the old one to be out  
the hole and started water saw one sail  
at sunset Rio bore S.W. dist 50 Miles

June 8  
1852

Remarks onboard Tuesday June 8th 1852  
First part of this day light breeze from West  
latter part fresh breeze from S.W. by E  
stopped at Bay took Mainboom out and  
reunited saw a number of shoals of Porpoise  
at sunset Royal bore S.W. dist 10 Miles

June 9  
1852

Remarks onboard Wednesday June 9th 1852  
First part of this day fresh breeze from S  
and squally latter part more moderate saw  
one Whaling ship, one Bark rigged the Mainboom  
unbent the Mainmast and bent the other one  
saw one Linbark and two shoals of Porpoise  
saw five sail of Merchantmen bound East
