June 10th
1852
Remarks onboard ~~June 10th~~ Thursday 1852
First part of this day, fresh breeze from N.E. and cloudy, latter part fresh gale from S.W. and squally. Saw one ~~Whaling~~ ^{Finback} also two Merchantmen bound to the Eastward at sunset. Flood bore North Dist 30 Miles

June 11th
1852
Remarks onboard Friday, June 11 1852
First part of this day fresh gale from N.W. and squally, latter part gentle breeze from N.E. and cloudy. Saw six sails of Merchant Vessels at sunset. Flood bore N.E. Distance 25 Miles

June 12th
1852
Remarks onboard Saturday June 12 1852
First part of this day light breeze from N.W. latter part calm. Saw two Whaling Barks and three Merchantmen at sunset. Capt Cook from Bark Spartan came onboard and stayed all night. Two Barks being 7 miles off at sunset. Flood bore North Distance 25 Miles

June 13th
1852
Remarks onboard Sunday June 13 1852
First part of this day, calm latter part light air from West gained with the Bark Spartan 14 Miles out with 250 bls Sperm. Saw two Merchantmen at sunset. Flood bore N. East Dist 20 Miles saw one shoal of Porpoise one of Killis

June 14th
1852
Remarks onboard Monday June 14 1852
All this day light air from N.W. West and squally. Saw several shoals of Porpoise and several Finbacks also three Whaling Barks likewise three Merchantmen bound East at sunset. Flood bore S.E. Distance 20 Miles

June 15th
1852
Remarks onboard Tuesday June 15 1852
First part of this day gentle breeze from S.W. latter part light breeze from N.W. Saw two Finbacks two shoals of Porpoise two Merchantmen and one Whaling Bark. Flood bore S.E. Dist 20 Miles

June 16th
1852
Remarks onboard Wednesday June 16 1852
All this day gentle breeze from N.W. West and cloudy. Saw two Finbacks two shoals of Porpoise and six Merchantmen bound to the Eastward spoke the schooner of Provincetown three Miles out 15 bls of Sperm to end this day. Lat 59-27 Long 52-52

June 17th
1852
Remarks onboard Thursday June 17 1852
First part of this day gentle breeze from S.W. latter part fresh breeze from N.W. Saw one Finback one shoal of Blackfish and one of Porpoise. Saw three Merchantmen bound to the Eastward. Lat 58-58 Long 53-34

June 18th
1852
Remarks onboard Friday June 18 1852
First part of this day, calm breeze from N.W. and squally. Latter part gentle breeze from West and cloudy. Saw one Merchant Brig bound S.E. Saw one shoal of Porpoise. Lat 59-27 Long 55-50

June 19th
1852
Remarks onboard Saturday June 19 1852
All this day fresh breeze from N.W. and squally. Saw three shoals of Porpoise also three Merchantmen bound to the Eastward. Lat 59-02 Long 52-40

June 20th
1852
Remarks onboard Sunday June 20 1852
First part of this day, fresh breeze from S.W. and squally, latter part light breeze from West and fine. Saw four sails of Merchantmen. Lat 59-15 Long 52-34

June 21th
1852
Remarks onboard Monday June 21 1852
First part of this day, gentle breeze from N.W. latter part fresh breeze from S.W. Saw two Merchantmen bound S.E. Spoke the Bark Spartan saw one Porpoise and two Finbacks at sunset. Flood bore S.E. Dist 20 Miles
