1852

Remarks onboard Thursday July 15th 1852
First part of this day, fresh breeze from S.W. and fair latter part gentle breeze from S.W. East saw three whales supposed to be Grampuses also any quantity of Pinbacks

July 16th

1852

Remarks onboard Friday July 16th 1852
First part of this day, gentle breeze from North and fine latter part Calm and clear, saw a Brig bound to the Westward saw three shoals of Grampuses and one of Porpoises
Lat 58-00 Long 39-28

July 17th

1852

Remarks onboard Saturday July 17th 1852
First part of this day, Calm latter part light breeze from S.W. and fine saw two shoals of Porpoises and a number of Grampuses saw one sail to ends this day
Lat 57-54 Long 38-36

July 18th

1852

Remarks onboard Sunday July 18th 1852
First part of this day, gentle breeze from S.W. and fine middle gradually from S.W. West latter part gentle breeze from S.W. and fine saw the Bark William Thompson of London bound West saw one shoal of Grampuses
Lat 59-22 Long 37-53

July 19th

1852

Remarks onboard Monday July 19th 1852
All this day Calm and clear saw three Pinbacks toward a Boat and shot a Bonellus at one but did not go in caught a Turtle and a Dolphin saw three sails turned in the Pit Stays and set it down saw one shoal of Porpoises

July 20th

1852

Remarks onboard Tuesday July 20th 1852
First part of this day calm latter part light air from S.W. saw (thousands of Porpoises & Pinbacks caught 8 fish
Lat 59-15 Long 36-20 saw one Whaling Ship and five other sails caught a Dolphin

July 21st

1852

Remarks onboard Wednesday July 21st 1852
First part of this day, gentle breeze from S.W. and fine latter part gentle breeze from S.W. West saw a shoal of Blackfish and one of Grampuses saw four sails bound to the Eastward all Merchants
Lat 59-36 Long 35-36

July 22nd

1852

Remarks onboard Thursday July 22nd 1852
First part of this day, gentle breeze from S.W. and fine latter part fresh breeze from S.W. West saw two Merchants bound Eastward saw small whaling supposed to be Grampuses
Lat 40-29 Long 34-49

July 23rd

1852

Remarks onboard Friday July 23rd 1852
First part of this day, gentle breeze from S.W. and cloudy latter part gentle breeze from S.W. West and clear saw one shoal of Porpoises at a Merchants
Lat 39-29 Long 33-49

July 24th

1852

Remarks onboard Saturday July 24th 1852
All this day, gentle breeze from S.W. and fine saw two shoals of Grampuses and one Pinback at sunset there were East Dist 30 Miles

July 25th

1852

Remarks onboard Sunday July 25th 1852
First part of this day, gentle breeze from S.W. and fine latter part Calm saw three Merchants bound to the Eastward also two Whales one Bark and Ship saw one shoal of Grampuses at sundown there were East Dist 12 Miles

July 26th

1852

Remarks onboard Monday July 26th 1852
First part of this day, light air from S.W. and fine latter part gentle breeze from South and fair saw one Pinback two shoals of Grampuses two shoals of Porpoises saw a Ship & a Bark receding at 10 miles saw the Brig General the Merchants bound East bound with the Spartan 250 tons of sperm oil at sundown there were East Dist 20 Miles
