July 27

1852

Remarks on board Tuesday July 27 1852
All this day, gentle breeze from S.W. and fair saw the Bark Spartan one Merchantmen bound East toward and chased Blackfish but did not strike saw two shoals of Grampuses one of Porpoises and a Finback sp. on other sail at sunset (Drew bore N.W. by S Dist 12 Miles)

July 28

1852

Remarks on board Wednesday July 28 1852
All this day, gentle breeze from S.W. and usually, sailed with the Brig, School of (Lured two Whales out. Clean saw several shoals of Grampuses saw one Ship & Bark Whalingmen at sunset (Drew bore N.W. Dist 10 Miles)

July 29

1852

Remarks on board Thursday July 29 1852
All this day, gentle breeze from S.W. and fair saw Grampuses without meeting two shoals of Porpoises one Finback saw the School the Ship also one sail of the whaler Barn and one of the whaler at sunset (Drew bore N.W. Dist 30 Miles)

July 30

1852

Remarks on board Friday July 30 1852
All this day, gentle breeze from S.W. and fair saw several shoals of Grampuses a Merchant Ship bound to the Eastward also a Brig bound to the Westward at sunset (Drew bore N.W. Dist 50 Miles)

July 31

1852

Remarks on board Saturday July 31 1852
All this day, winds variable, from S.W. to N.W. saw Grampuses with out gunners one shoal of Porpoises saw five Merchantmen bound Eastward and one going off and on (Drew bore N.W. Dist 4 Miles)

August

1852

Remarks on board Sunday August 1st 1852
First part of this day, Calm latter part gentle breeze from North and fine saw small shoals of Grampuses saw one Whaling Boat two Merchantmen bound Eastward and Floof at sunset (Drew bore N.W. Dist 5 Miles)

August 2

1852

Remarks on board Monday August 2nd 1852
All this day, gently breeze from N.W. and cloudy saw small shoals of Grampuses saw the September 29 days out, Clean Bark arrived of New Bedford Mist, Master's watch out yet 60 lbs of sperm saw three Whaling Ships and one Bark, hauled at Flores and took on board 80 lbs of Water and gave the Starboard Boat Crew Liberty of 8 hours at sunset (Drew bore N.W. Dist 10 Miles)

Aug 3

1852

Remarks on board Tuesday Aug 3 1852
All this day, strong Gale from North saw six Whalingmen chase the Bark Cowe of Orleans 40 days out 15 lbs of sperm the Starboard Boat Crew went on shore at 7 o'clock A.M. three Whalingmen out at 12 o'clock all came off at 12 o'clock William Conway and George Rice at one o'clock the Mast Boat on liberty and all came off at 8 P.M. took on board the Potatoes, Onions at sunset (Drew bore N.W. Dist 4 Miles)

August 4

1852

Remarks on board Wednesday August 4 1852
All this day, fresh gales from North and cloudy, took the Bark Spartan saw nothing, since saw her last at 40 fathoms the Captain came on board would not get the two men that were away but heard of them being recovered offered a reward of \$5; doled; after waiting 24 hours left to return after 4 days expecting them to get there, saw several Whalingmen Ships and Barks to ends this day saw several Grampuses sperm, & the Grampuses at sunset (Drew bore North Dist 25 Miles)
