 1852 Remarks onboard Tuesday Sept 7th 1852
 First part of this day fresh breeze from North
 and squally latter part gentle breeze from N.E.
 and fine weather the old Foresail & Mainsail
 and Bent the new ones so ends this day, all well
 Lat 35-34 Long 36-10

Sept 8th
 1852 Remarks onboard Wednesday Sept 8th 1852
 First part of this day light air from N.W.
 and fine latter part gentle breeze from S.W. and
 cloudy saw one shoal of Porpoise boarded the
 ship called of for Baltimore 23 Days from
 Liverpool and sent letters to the States
 Lat 35-40 Long 35-55

Sept 9th
 1852 Remarks onboard Thursday Sept 9th 1852
 First part of this day fresh gale from South
 and squally latter part gentle breeze from
 West of North and fair so ends this day
 Lat 36-47 Long 36-31

Sept 10th
 1852 Remarks onboard Friday Sept 10th 1852
 First part of this day light air from NW
 and squally latter part gentle breeze from
 South and cloudy saw one small breeze supposed
 to be a Grampus caught one Porpoise
 Lat 38-11 Long 35-41

Sept 11th
 1852 Remarks onboard Saturday Sept 11th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from S.W.
 and squally Middle the same with heavy rain
 latter part gentle breeze from W.S.W. and fair
 saw two Merchantmen bound to the Eastward
 Lat 38-40 Long 34-49

Sept 12th
 1852 Remarks onboard Sunday Sept 12th 1852
 First part of this day fresh breeze from
 S.W. and fair latter part gentle breeze
 from West and fair with flying clouds
 Lat 39-30 Long 34-22

Sept 13th *Continued*
 1852 Remarks onboard Monday Sept 13th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from S.W.
 and squally latter part gentle breeze from N.W.
 and fair saw two Merchantmen bound Eastward
 saw one Whaler Pinback Grampus so ends this day
 Lat 39-28 Long 32-07

Sept 14th
 1852 Remarks onboard Tuesday Sept 14th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from S.W. and
 squally latter part fresh breeze from South and
 cloudy saw two Blackfish also saw a Whaling Bark
 at 10 A.M. bound N.E. Dist 50 Miles
 saw one shoal of Porpoise so ends this day

Sept 15th
 1852 Remarks onboard Wednesday Sept 15th 1852
 First part of this day fresh breeze from South
 and squally latter part gentle breeze from S.W.
 and fair saw a Grampus and a Whaler at sunset
 Lat 39-40 Long 30-10

Sept 16th
 1852 Remarks onboard Thursday Sept 16th 1852
 First part of this day fresh breeze from West and
 squally latter part fresh breeze from N.E. East
 and squally stretched at 12 o'clock for Kermadec saw two
 or a down sail of Ship Barks and Brig all Whaling
 at sunset (Lugal bar North Dist 1 mile)

Sept 17th
 1852 Remarks onboard Friday Sept 17th 1852
 First part of this day fresh gale from N.E. East
 and squally latter part more moderate it being
 so rough that we could not take of our Permitta
 so ends this day there being 12 Sails of Whaling
 in sight at sunset (Lugal bar N.W. Dist 1 mile)

Sept 18th
 1852 Remarks onboard Saturday Sept 18th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from N.E.
 and fair latter part gentle breeze and fine
 took onboard 20 Bushels of Potatoes and 200 Cods
 of Wood besides other fruit saw 13 Sails of Whaling
 at sunset (Lugal bar N.E. Dist 3 miles)
