Remarks onboard Sunday Sept 19th 1852
First part of this day gentle breeze from N.E. and fine latter part light air from E.S.E. and squally. Saw two sails supposed to be a Whalingman at sunset (Rec. bear S.E. East Dist 60 Miles)

Sept 20th 1852
Remarks onboard Monday Sept 20th 1852
First part of this day moderate and squally, latter part fresh breeze from E.S.E. and fair saw one shoal of Porbeird two shoals of Scamper also two sails supposed to be a Whalingman two Berricks at sunset (Rec. bear S.E. East Dist 50 Miles)

Sept 21st 1852
Remarks onboard Tuesday Sept 21st 1852
First part of this day fresh breeze from E.S.E. and fair latter part fresh gale from East and squally. Saw one sail supposed to be a Whalingman at sunset (Rec. bear S.E. East Dist 50 Miles)

Sept 22nd 1852
Remarks onboard Wednesday Sept 22nd 1852
First part of this day fresh gale from East with a heavy sea latter part more moderate and squally. Saw one sail a Whaler at sunset (Rec. bear S.E. East Dist 50 Miles)

Sept 23rd 1852
Remarks onboard Thursday Sept 23rd 1852
First part of this day moderate and squally with a heavy sea latter part light air from South and cloudy. Saw one sail supposed to be a Whalingman at sunset (Rec. bear S.E. East Dist 50 Miles)

Sept 24th 1852
Remarks onboard Friday Sept 24th 1852
First part of this day light air from N.W. and fair latter part gentle breeze from N.W. and fine parted the Cove for the open sea and land

Sept 25th 1852
Remarks onboard Saturday Sept 25th 1852
First part of this day gentle breeze from W.N.W. and fine latter part gentle breeze from W and cloudy. Saw two sails supposed to be a Whaler at sunset (Rec. bear S.E. East Dist 50 Miles)

Sept 26th 1852
Remarks onboard Sunday Sept 26th 1852
First part of this day gentle breeze from West and squally. Latter part fresh gale from S.E. and squally. Saw two Merchantmen bound to the S.W. also saw one Drift net yesterday at sunset (Rec. bear S.E. East Dist 50 Miles)

Sept 27th 1852
Remarks onboard Monday Sept 27th 1852
First part of this day fresh gale from S.E. and squally. Latter part more moderate and cloudy. Saw two Merchantmen bound to the S.W. also saw one Drift net at sunset (Rec. bear S.E. East Dist 50 Miles)

Sept 28th 1852
Remarks onboard Tuesday Sept 28th 1852
First part of this day fresh breeze from S.E. and squally. Latter part more moderate. Spoke the Bark Vigilant of New Bedford 3 Months out. Saw one other sail supposed to be a Merchantman. Storm and squally did not save him so ends. This day all well

Sept 29th 1852
Remarks onboard Wednesday Sept 29th 1852
First part of this day light air from East and fair latter part gentle breeze from S.W. and fine. Saw four sails of Merchantmen bound to the S.W.

Sept 30th 1852
Remarks onboard Thursday Sept 30th 1852
First part of this day light air from S.W. and fair latter part fresh breeze from S.W. and squally. Saw two Merchantmen bound to the S.W.

Sept 1st 1852
Remarks onboard Friday October 1st 1852
First part of this day light air from S.W. and cloudy. Latter part more and rainy. Spoke the Bark Master of New Bedford 3 Months out. Also saw two other sails bound to the S.W.
