1852

Remarks onboard Tuesday Nov 16 1852  
First part of this day, light air from N.W. and  
cloudy, latter part light air from North, and fine  
saw the Brig, Ceran Phoenix and the ship Amela  
Boiled out the Blackfish to end this day  
at sunset took the bar N.W. Dist 8 Miles

Nov 17

1852

Remarks onboard Wednesday Nov 17 1852  
First part of this day calm and clear latter  
part light air from East and fine saw  
one shoal of Blackfish stored down the  
Blackfish Oil two being three half the saw  
the Brig, Ceran Phoenix and the ship Amela  
at sunset took the bar N.W. Dist 15 Miles

Nov 18

1852

Remarks onboard Thursday Nov 18 1852  
First part of this day light from S. East and  
fine latter part gentle breeze from East and pleasant  
saw one shoal of Blackfish saw the Amela took  
latter part the Brig, Ceran Phoenix and the ship  
at sunset South End of Easter Island bar N.W. Dist 11

Nov 19

1852

Remarks onboard Friday Nov 19 1852  
All this day, gentle breeze from East and fine  
saw one Finback one shoal of Porpoise at 11 o'clock  
raised a shoal of Seals (Whales) forward stored  
and by supposed to mark 80 fathoms two  
Boats and left one Sun to end this day  
Turturavina South point N.W. Dist 12 Miles

Nov 20

1852

Remarks onboard Saturday Nov 20 1852  
All this day, gentle breeze from N.E. and fine  
but in the P.M. hazy and started to work at sunset  
West point of Easter Island bar N. Dist 15 Miles

Nov 21

1852

Remarks onboard Sunday Nov 21 1852  
All this day, gentle breeze from N.E. and fine  
kind the Pump and Cask and shipped the Saw  
at sunset West point of Easter Island bar N.W. Dist 12 Miles

Nov 22

1852

Remarks onboard Monday Nov 22 1852  
All this day, gentle breeze from N.E. and fine  
at the school cone of the Seamen named Coleman  
cut his left hand a point off with a Missing Knife  
to end this day, sailing and bound for the Grand  
Canary to land from at sunset Easter Island  
bar N. East Dist 10 Miles

Nov 23

1852

Remarks onboard Tuesday Nov 23 1852  
First part of this day, gentle breeze from N.E.  
and fine latter part fresh breeze from N.E.  
and cloudy, touched at the Grand Canary and  
land the Wounded Man and left this same  
day at sunset Easter Island bar N.W. Dist 15 Miles

Nov 24

1852

Remarks onboard Wednesday Nov 24 1852  
First part of this day, fresh breeze from N.E.  
and cloudy, latter part gentle breeze from N.W. and  
fine saw two shoals of Porpoise and small small  
boats to end this day, finished a Boiling milk  
at sunset the S. end of Easter Island bar N.W. Dist 10

Nov 25

1852

Remarks onboard Thursday Nov 25 1852  
All this day, light air from N.W. S.W. and  
pleasant saw one shoal of Porpoise stored  
latter part the Oil two being 24 of Head  
and 57 of Body to end this day all well  
at sunset West point of Easter Island bar N.W. Dist 15 Miles

Nov 26

1852

Remarks onboard Friday Nov 26 1852  
First part of this day, light air from North  
and clear latter part gentle breeze from N.E.  
saw Finback Bay from 5 to 7 took in the Larboard  
Boat and mended her and put her out again  
at sunset took the bar N.W. Dist 15 Miles

Nov 27

1852

Remarks onboard Saturday Nov 27 1852  
All this day, gentle breeze from N.E. and  
fine saw Porpoise Finbacks and Blackfish  
saw a Whaling ship supposed to be the Amela  
at sunset took the bar N.W. Dist 4 Miles
